

1 DECEMBER AUTHORITY OF THE ADJUTANT GENERAL

Battalion located at Mitterheim, 1525 hrs. 1 December 1944. Division Reserve under control of Combat Command "A".

2 DECEMBER 1944

Orders from Combat Command Reserve alerted the Battalion at 0300 to be prepared to move on order to vicinity of Mackwiller. Orders came to move out at 1000. Route of march - Mitterheim, Fenetrange, Niederstinzel, Wolfkirchen, to Burbach. Battalion assembled in vicinity 555355.

3 DECEMBER 1944

Battalion remained in the same assembly area. Orders came to alert one medium company to assist in clearing Sarre Union. Sarre Union had been counterattacked by several enemy tanks with infantry earlier. "A" Company moved to vicinity 510345 after dark prepared to move on Sarre Union at first light.

The remainder of the Battalion was alerted to be prepared to move on order after 0730 4 December 1944.

4 DECEMBER 1944

"A" Company moved into Sarre Union supported by 26th Infantry Division. Reported mission complete at 0845. One enemy tank (abandoned) and one sniper killed.

Battalion now in Combat Command "A". Orders came to be prepared to move northeast through Task Force ODEN (35th Tk Bn and 53rd Inf) after they had established a bridgehead over the river at Damfessel - Order of March in the Battalion: Co "A", Co "B", Co "C" and Co "D".

Battalion was alerted to move on its mission at 1115. The mission was to march northeast and secure the high ground vicinity Singling, Rohrbach-les-Hitics, and Binning. These towns were fortified towns in the Maginot Line.

The attack was carried out with the 37th Tank Battalion leading, infantry and artillery support was coordinated in the beginning. On reaching an area just south of Singling the tanks were out of support of artillery fire. Most of the artillery had attempted to displace forward so as a result not enough fire could be obtained. This was due in most part to the fact that only one very poor road was open. The Battalion consolidated their position 1000 yards south of Singling.

Ltr, Hq 37th Tank Bn, 7 Jan 1945 cont'd:

6 DECEMBER 1944

Orders were received to assault Bining and Rohrbach while CCB took Singling. The force encountered enemy pillboxes and direct anti-tank and tank fire. Most of the enemy resistance was encountered from Singling and the high ground about the town which hit our exposed flank. CCB had not yet come up to attack Singling so it was decided to take this objective before proceeding on to our own. This was accomplished after overcoming stiff enemy resistance. In the meanwhile the 1st bn, 328th Inf, 26th Division (which had been attached to us) was inclined to move into Bining with "D" Co in support. This too was accomplished against heavy enemy opposition and the force occupied and outpost the town that night. By the time CCB had come up and relieved the force in Singling it was too dark for further action so the battalion (less D Co) assembled in the same position held yesterday.

Orders came from Combat Command "A" to hold fast and repel any Counter-attacks until we are relieved by the 12th Armd. Div.

7 DECEMBER 1944

During the morning tank force in Bining repulsed several enemy counter-attacks. Battalion ordered to move at 2100 to a vicinity 555355.

8 DECEMBER 1944

All elements were closed in bivouac by 0600 and at 0900 orders were received to proceed to vicinity of Mittersheim.

9 - 12 DECEMBER 1944

No enemy activity was encountered during this period. All time was spent in recuperation and maintenance.

13 DECEMBER 1944

At 1500, orders were issued from CCR to alert one medium tank company. This company was to march to Achen to support the 87th Infantry Division. "A" Company received orders from the 87th Division that led them to believe they would be committed the following day.

14 DECEMBER 1944

"A" Company moved out at 0800 for area vicinity of Achen. Remainder of the battalion still in the area of Mittersheim carrying on with training.

Ltr. Hq 37th Tank Bn, 7 Jan 1945 cont'd:

15 DECEMBER 1944

At 1500, orders were received from the Battalion Commander to alert the remainder of the battalion and prepare immediately to move forward in support of the 87th Division. Battalion moved out at 1545 under command of the Executive Officer to vicinity 570460 1/2 mi NE Germingen. Orders were issued to be prepared to move at 0715 in the morning. Order of March- Rcn, Hq, Hq Co, D, B, C.

16 DECEMBER 1944

Head of column moved out at 0715 and arrived in assembly area 615543 2 mi NE of Woelfling.

"C" Company was to relieve "A" Company and be attached to the 347th Infantry Regiment. "B" Company was attached to the 345th Infantry Regiment.

Small arms mortar and artillery fire were met by our units but advancing elements continued to proceed forward slowly. Penetrations were made into Germany Proper. The first in the battalion was "A" Company in command of Lt. Walters.

17 DECEMBER 1944

First word was received of enemy penetrations to the north (Belgium and Luxembourg).

Several anti-tank guns were found in position and destroyed. Penetrations were made into Germany Proper by the remaining companies of the battalion.

Heavy artillery and mortar fire being met by our heading elements. The supporting infantry experienced heavy small arms and machine gun fire on some sectors.

Tanks were reported and seen in this sector and several were engaged at long range.

18 DECEMBER 1944

Companies still in the same general area. Considerable difficulty was experienced in resupplying the tanks due to artillery fire and the mud.

Reconnaissance platoon still doing the liaison work between the companies and battalion headquarters.

Several enemy planes were seen in the area. Intense anti-aircraft fire prevented them from strafing or doing any accurate observation.

The battalion holding high ground just north and east of Nieder Gailbach.

Not much change in the situation is contemplated. The enemy appears to be fighting a stiff delaying action.

Ltr. Hq. 37th Tank Bn. 7 Jan 1945 cont'd:

19 DECEMBER 1944

Battalion still holding same ground as previous day. Enemy fire consisted of artillery and mortar fire. Nature of terrain and mud prevented any extensive cross-country maneuvering.

Orders were received that the Battalion would be relieved from attachment to the 87th Inf. Div. and return to Mittersheim and from there to a destination, unknown as yet, in Belgium. The mission was to counter-attack, from the south, the German salient in the Ardennes.

Orders were received as to the route of march, time of departure. Route of March - Fenestrange, Behesstraff, Morhange, Pont a Mousson, Arnaville, Conflans, Longwy. Time of Departure - 0830.

The Division now under III Corps control. 37th Tank Bn in "CCR".

20 DECEMBER 1944

Battalion moved out at 0830, arrived in assembly area $\frac{1}{2}$ mile South Meix-le-Tige, Belgium at 2330. Service Co. closed at 0700, 22 Dec 1944.

Orders received from "CCR" to proceed north through Arlon to C/R 2 kilometers N. Arlon. Be prepared to move North on order from there. Battalion moved out at 0715 and closed in assembly area (P609249) at 1330.

21 DECEMBER 1944

Battalion remained in assembly at Meix-le-Tige. Maintenance of vehicles was necessary. Rehabilitation was begun immediately.

22 DECEMBER 1944

Vicinity C/R 2 miles N. Arlon. Orders received from Hq "CCR" to move out to N. at 0600. Mission to contact enemy elements reported in vicinity Flatzbourghoff to destroy all enemy elements and proceed northward.

Ltr. Hq 37th Tank Bn. 7 Jan 1945 cont'd:

23 DECEMBER 1944

Battalion moved out at 0600. Order of March - B/37, B/53, 37 D/37 will remain. Route of March - Perle, Holts to Flatsbourghoff. Radio Silence until 0730. Battalion went into an assembly area 19 kilometers South of Flatsbourghoff. Assault and mortar platoons established OPs and registered.

First enemy contact gained just south of Flatsbourghoff by Co "B" in the form of mortar, small arms and direct AT fire. Enemy infantry was seen with white helmets and capes. Orders were issued for the attack by Bn CO, tanks to advance cross country with infantry mounted on tanks and the remainder in half-tracks. Artillery preparations were laid on woods and possible AT positions.

Attack was launched and objectives were taken, orders were issued to proceed on toward Bigonville. Before Bigonville could be reached it was too dark so the elements outposted the high ground North of Flatsbourghoff. Losses - 2 medium tanks destroyed, 1 Officer and 3 EM KIA.

Enemy losses: 2 SP, 75mm, 1 German operated Sherman tank; estimated 30 enemy dead.

Orders received from Hq CCR to launch an attack on Bigonville at first light.

24 DECEMBER 1944

Battalion with Inf and Arty support to attack Bigonville at 0800. Resistance was met immediately on entering the town in the form of small arms, artillery, bazookas, and direct AT fire. The attack progressed slowly and by nightfall the high ground to the north and east of the village had been taken and outposted. Infantry succeeded in cleaning out most of the town.

Enemy casualties were unknown dead. 428 prisoners (paratroopers, some being women), 39 American EM and 3 Officers who were prisoners were rescued, also 2 40-mm Bofors. AA guns, 1 2½ ton truck, 1 1½ ton truck, 2 ½ ton trucks, 1 water trailer were retaken.

The battalion held defensive positions on the high ground and awaited orders.

Orders received from CCR were to move at 1230 from our present position to the Division's left flank.

25 DECEMBER 1944

The head of the column moved out from an area SW of HERCHEUZ at 1230, after having completed a thirty (30) mile night march from BIGONVILLE. The composition of the column was as follows:

94th FA to support from present location

The immediate plan of action was as follows:

According to S-2 information VAUX LES ROSIERES had very few enemy in it. PETITE ROSIERES was known to contain more enemy. D/37, B/53, Eng, and C/704 were to continue through VAUX LES ROSIERES in column, and without halt. At PETITE ROSIERES, D/37 would continue to march and take up a position on the high ground NE of the village. Their position to be supplemented by C/704. Captain McMahon, Bn S-2, was in command of this group. B/53 was to clear the town out, which they did, taking sixty-five (65) prisoners.

The remainder of the column was to turn E in PETITE ROSIERES and proceed toward NIVES, and CORREVILLE. The first element to turn here was A/37; this company assisted by A/53 cleared NIVES. As this was going on C/37 plus C/53 proceeded to CORREVILLE and cleared that town. This was completed by 1430. Artillery support on these towns was provided on call by the 94th FA. These fires were pre-arranged.

It was reported by Lt. Boggess, CO Company "C", that the bridge just out of CORREVILLE on the road to REMOVILLE had been blown, producing a large crater. The bulldozer was ordered forward and proceeded to fill the crater with a large stone wall that was nearby. The tanks of C/37 and A/37 overwatched this operation. This was completed at approximately 1515 and C/37 plus C/53 proceeded to high ground W of REMOVILLE and overlooking the town. A/37 plus A/53 proceeded into REMOVILLE on the road, all guns firing and supported by direct fire from C/37. As A/37 and A/53 proceeded to clear the town, C/37 and C/53 moved down and along the W edge of town. While this was going on B/37 took up a position on high ground about one (1) kilometer W of CORREVILLE, this to cover to the NE. After REMOVILLE was cleared, the town was outposted and A and B/37 exchanged positions, and C/37 took up a position N of the town. There was no artillery fire on this town due to the proximity of CCB on the E flank. Over three hundred (300) prisoners were taken from the town. The command spent the night of 25-26 December in these positions.

26 DECEMBER 1944

At 0925, the artillery opened up on REMICHAMPAGNE, and the BOIS De COHET. Simultaneously as the tanks and infantry started moving N, and the artillery was pouring it on, the P-47s started to bomb and strafe. The BOIS de COHET was given good doing over. The coordination of tanks, infantry, artillery, and air was to perfection. Planes came over tanks at antenna altitude and strafed to the front. The combination of artillery and planes took care of the BOIS de COHET, which was the unknown quantity.

In the attack on REMICHAMPAGNE B/37 and B/53 paralleled the NS road from REMOVILLE to REMICHAMPAGNE and swung over and into REMICHAMPAGNE from the S. C/37 plus C/53 moved to the W of the town covering the town, and were ready to support with direct fire. Artillery fire was kept on the town as long as possible and then supplanted by direct fire from C/37. When REMICHAMPAGNE was cleared up, B/37 and B/53 moved to a position just SW of CLOCHIMONT, and overlooking that town. Artillery fire was put on CLOCHIMONT, C/37 and C/53 moved to a position about one (1) kilometer NW of REMICHAMPAGNE to cover in direction of SIRET and VILLEROUX. At approximately 1500 and continuing for almost an hour, hundreds of C-47s came over and flew to BASTOGNE dropping supplies to the garrison there.

At 1520, Lt. Col. Abrams called up Captain Cwright, Bn S-3, and ordered him to bring C/37 and C/53 forward to B/37's position, saying "this is it".

Upon reaching B/37's position, the orders were given by Colonel Abrams. They were as follows:

C/37 and C/53 will march on ASSENOIS, go through it and continue on until contact is made with elements of the 101st Airborne Division. B/53 will follow and will clean out ASSENOIS. C/37 and C/53 will be under command of Captain Dwight and will be supported by three (3) Battalions of 105 and one (1) Battalion of 155mm artillery. Artillery to be on call from anyone in the force and to be lifted by call. The artillery will hit the town of ASSENOIS and the edges of both woods to the N of ASSENOIS.

After all tank commanders and infantry platoon leaders were given the situation the force moved out at 1610, tanks leading, as is customary.

Upon coming into sight of ASSENOIS, Lt. Boggess, called for the prepared artillery fire. The fire came like the rains; few if any rounds missing their mark. As the edge of the town was reached Boggess called for the fire to lift and proceeded into the town without waiting for the fire to cease.

Due to the heavy artillery fire two tanks were unable to find their way through town. One infantry halftrack got forward into the tank column. One halftrack suffered a direct hit in the town. None of the tanks were fired upon by the enemy in the town, although there was considerable ineffective anti-tank fire as the column approached the town.

As the force left ASSENOIS it was composed as follows: Lt. Boggess' tank, Lt. Wrolson's tank, another tank, a break in the column of approximately 300 yards, an infantry halftrack, another tank and the S-3's tank. All went well as the force proceeded on, firing 30 calibre machine guns into the woods on both sides of the road.

26 DECEMBER 1945 CONT'D

During the aforementioned bread in the column, the enemy threw Teller mines on the road in a bottle neck created by the woods. The infantry half-track hit one of these mines and was destroyed, catching fire immediately. After the mines were thrown into the ditches, the work being done under cover of 50 calibre fire from a tank, the two remaining tanks continued on the rejoined the leading element which by this time (1650) had contacted elements of the 326th Engineers or the 101st Airborne Division. In the meantime, B/53 started to clear out ASSENOIS, and Colonel Abrams started forward with the remainder of C/53 and two C/37 tanks. By this time there was considerable activity in ASSENOIS which contained an enemy Battalion and Regimental CPs. Some 428 prisoners were finally taken from the town.

During this time Captain Dwight was met by Brigadier General McAuliffe, acting Commanding General of the 101st Airborne Division, who came to the perimeter defenses of BASTOGNE.

By 1830, all of C/37 and C/53 had taken up positions on the perimeter defense. Colonel Abrams went to the 101st Airborne Division CP to make arrangements to get their trains through. C/53 lost five (5) half-tracks on the mission. One by our own artillery, one by mines, and three by bazooka fire. It was obvious, after the battle, that the force would have had considerable trouble if it had waited for the artillery to lift.

Colonel Abrams called Colonel Jacques at approximately 1930 and asked to have A/53 come up and clear the edges to the woods North of ASSENOIS.

27 - 28 DECEMBER 1944

The edges to the woods NORTH of ASSENOIS as requested were cleared by 0300, December 27, 1944; the road was safe for passage of all types of vehicles. This task was performed against strong enemy opposition and in an heavily wooded area.

D/37 escorted the trains of the 101st and 10th Armored into BASTOGNE. The trains consisted of some forty (40) trucks and seventy (70) ambulances. Up to this time D/37 has covered the NW flank from the same general area it took up on the 25th.

In the area between CLOCHIMONT and ASSENOIS were seven (7) anti-tank guns of 75mm or larger, one blocking the entrance to ASSENOIS. Between ASSENOIS and the perimeter defense of BASTOGNE were eight (8) more guns. In the woods on both sides of the road N of ASSENOIS were 25 - 30 assorted enemy vehicles, including full track prime movers. There was at least one thousand enemy soldiers. The above weapons were ineffective due to fast, decisive movement, and accurate, well coordinated artillery fire, coupled with excellent air support.

During the above operations the strength of the line companies never exceeded the figures below:

At 0925, the artillery opened up on REMICHAUPAGNE, and the BOIS de COIN. Artillery fire was kept on the town as long as possible and then supplanted by direct fire from C/37. When REMICHAUPAGNE was cleared up, B/37 and B/53 moved to a position just SW of CLOCHIMONT, and overlooking that town. Artillery fire was put on CLOCHIMONT, C/37 and C/53 moved to a position about one (1) kilometer NW of REMICHAUPAGNE to cover the NW flank. At the present stage the time was approximately 1430. A/37 moved to the high ground NW of CLOCHIMONT to cover in direction of SIBRET and VILLEROUX. At approximately 1500 and continuing for almost an hour, hundreds of C-47's came over and flew to BASTOGNE dropping supplies to the garrison there.

At 1520, Lt. Col. Abrams called up Captain Dwight, Bn S-3, and ordered him to bring C/37 and C/53 forward to B/37's position, saying "this is it".

Upon reaching B/37's position the orders were given by Colonel Abrams. They were as follows:

C/37 and C/53 will march on ASSENOIS, go through [redacted] and continue on until contact is made with elements of the 101st Airborne Division. B/53 will follow and will clean out ASSENOIS. 28 DECEMBER, 1944

Bombers were over again at 0500 this morning. The day broke cloudy and did not look good as far as air support for troops in Bastogne.

C/37 received small arms fire from woods to their Southeast at 1000. "B" Company was alerted to aid the 53rd in cleaning out some woods between the road up which we had advanced and the main road just North of Assenois. Fog was heavy making visibility almost nil. No enemy were found in the woods.

Rec Platoon went to Assenois in search of a suitable Battalion CP.

A platoon of the 467th AAA Battalion was attached to the 37th for support against air attack. Plans were made to open fire on enemy planes tonight.

Lt. Col. Abrams has gone to Division to see the Commanding General.

"A" and "B" Companies were still in position keeping open the supply routes.

29 DECEMBER, 1944

At 0030, a call came from the 101st Airborne to be alert for a possible push from the North and Northeast. Captain Lamison was called to the 101st Airborne Division CP at 0500. At 0530, Lt. North went to CCR as Liaison Officer. Captain Lamison returned with word that we were to move to the vicinity of Clochimont, 515522.

At 1900, Bastogne was bombed and strafed by an unknown number of enemy planes. A number of near hits were scored on our Battalion area. Major Bautz's tank was nearly hit. A direct hit was scored on "B" Company's kitchen truck. One man was seriously injured. The Battalion cooperated with the anti-aircraft platoon in firing on the planes.

The area was bombed about six (6) times during the night. The last five attacks were lighter than the first. In the course of the night, three (3) enemy planes were downed.

Orders were received to move to Clochimont at 0900, tomorrow morning.

30 DECEMBER, 1944

The Battalion area was again bombed heavily at 0710, but no serious damage resulted.

At 0900, the Battalion moved out for Clochimont and arrived there at 0945. The order of march was Hq Co, D, A, B, C, and Service elements.

A Company Commanders meeting was held. Counterattacks made during the night had been repulsed. We were to be ready to move at anytime in the event of an attack on either flank. Reports indicated that enemy in U. S. uniforms are infiltrating through our lines.

30 DECEMBER, 1944 (CONT'D)

Colonel Blanchard of CCR brought orders at 1545 for us to move to the vicinity of Chaumont, 518488, to be in position in case of an attack from front flank.

The Battalion moved out at 1620. The order of march was Rch, Hq, Hq Co, A, B, and C. The Battalion arrived at the assembly area at 1700.

31 DECEMBER, 1944

For a change, the night was quiet as was this morning. During the night enemy aircraft strafed our bivouac area, however, no damage resulted.






