
# OTHER UNITS

Twenty-seven battle honors have been won by the 2nd Anti-Aircraft Artillery Battalion for service in the War of 1812, Civil War, Mexican War and World War II. Silver bands for guidon peaks have been awarded three batteries: A, 1; B, 5; C, 2.

The 501st Military Police company participated in five campaigns with the 1st Armored Division as the 501st Military Police platoon. The 501st Replacement company is credited with participation in the Rhineland campaign.

The 701st Armored Infantry Battalion was attached to "Old Ironsides" throughout the division's seven campaigns. Company B is entitled to carry a streamer in the colors of the French Croix de Guerre with palm.

Five battle honors were won by the 702nd Armored Infantry Battalion in Europe. The unit was cited in the Order of the Day of the Belgian Army for action in Belgium and again in the Ardennes. Company B is entitled to the distinguished unit streamer and headquarters company to the meritorious unit streamer.

The battle records of nine 1st Armored Division units were earned while serving with other divisions in World War II.


The 100th Tank Battalion (Hv) holds 22 battle honors for service in the Indian Wars, the Civil War, the War with Spain, the Philippine Insurrection and World War II. Company C is entitled to six silver bands for participation in the Mexican War.

The distinguished unit streamer was awarded the 73rd Armored Field Artillery Battalion for service with the 9th Armored Division through three campaigns in Europe. Service battery is entitled to display the meritorious unit streamer.

Action in the area of Mons and again in the area of Eupen-Malmedy won for the 634th Armored Infantry Battalion a citation in the Belgian Order of the Day. The battalion won five battle honors.

The 25th Armored Infantry Battalion received battle honors during the Indian Wars, War with Spain, Philippine Insurrection and in World War II. The "Onward" battalion served 10 years in Texas during the Indian Wars.

### "OLD IRONSIDES"

In the early years of World War II, the United States formed and shipped out a hastily-organized and trained experimental armored units as its hopeful answer to the furious German Panzer divisions of the Afrika Corps.

"Old Ironsides" was the name tacked onto this division, activated at Fort Knox, Kentucky on July 15, 1940. The name proved an appropriate one for by May 2, 1945, the armored drive spearheaded by the 1st Armored division had knifed its way beyond the Swiss border in an effort to meet French troops in a two-way push which preceded the complete German collapse in Italy.

The route between those dates had been long and difficultarduous maneuvering in Louisiana and the Carolinas . . . hard training over the hills of Ireland . . . an inch-by-inch fight against an enemy who usually had air and armor superiority.

During 30 months of combat, the division compiled an outstanding record. Enemy losses in men and equipment could not be counted; more than 95,000 Germans surrendered to the division's 13 bat-

The 27th Armored Field Artillery Battalion spent more than 550 days in firing position and had more combat time then any other organization in the division. Battery C was awarded a presidential unit citation for its heroic stand north of Medjez el Bab in Tunisia.

For its role in covering the withdrawal through Kasserine Pass against a heavy armor attack, the 68th Armored Field Artillery Battalion was awarded a presidential citation.

For service behind enemy lines while with the 88th Infantry Division, the 81st Reconnaissance Battalion was awarded a streamer in the colors of the French Croix de Guerre with Palm.

The 16th Armored Engineer Battalion perfected the U.S. technique of removing German mines, and in combat developed a tank-dozer that was adopted as an improvement over the War Department model. Company A is entitled to carry a distinguished unit streamer for action at Mt. Porchia.

The 91st Armored Field Artillery Battalion set a unique record in May, 1944, by firing 10,500 rounds of 105 and 75-mm ammunition at the Germans in a 24-hour period.

The 1st Medium Tank Battalion, tracing its history to the old 1st Cavalry Regiment, can point to 61 battle streamers on its standard.

The 13th Medium Tank Battalion, first organized in 1901 under another name, participated in all seven of the decisive (sf Armored Division campaigns in World War II.

Veterans of the 1st and 13th were taken from their units in 1944 to form the 4th Medium Tank Battalion.

Invention of a surgical truck and a "rolling drug store" is credited to the 47th Armored Medical Battalion. That unit is entitled to a meritorious unit streamer embroidered.


The 123rd Armored Ordnance Maintenance Battalion is also entitled to a meritorious unit streamer embroidered. That unit issued more than 10,000 replacement vehicles during the war period.

The 141st Armored Signal Company, participants in all seven campaigns, kept 1400 radios and 400 telephones in working order and laid or issued more than 54,000 miles of telephone wire.


The 1st Quartermaster Battalion participated in the landing near Oran, North Africa, and followed the division through five World War II campaigns. The 1st Armored Division Band, formed from bands of the 1st and 13th Armored Regiments, was with the division through four campaigns in Italy.







### LONG HORN IN RETROSPECT

A post-armistice view of the 17-day maneuver period cut an impressive record that few individual participants appreciated:

We had no fatal or serious accidents. The sick rate hit an all-time low and vehicle maintenance was at an all-time high. No company or large-size unit of the division was surprised or captured. Many of the Aggressor units were taken en masse.

The division's mobility impressed everyone. Some armored units advanced as much as 20 miles in 90 minutes, and the division drove back the Aggressor 30 miles in 24 hours of attacking along a 30-mile front. The division aviation section flew a total of 831 hours; during one night's operation, the section recorded 268 landings and take-offs in a 190-minute period.

The maneuver ended. Many new "Firsts" had been added to the division's proud record.
