1. The following operations report for the elements of Combat Command "A", Second Armored Division, for the month of June 1944 is hereby submitted:

1 June: Assembled at TIDWORTH BARRACKS, Wiltshire, England. Troops assigned to CC "A":
Hq CC "A"
66th Armored Regiment
3rd Bn, 41st Armored Infantry Regiment
14th Armored Field Artillery Battalion
Co A and 1st & 2nd Co B, 17th Armored Engineer Battalion
Co A, 48th Armored Medical Battalion
Co A, 2d Armored Maintenance Battalion
At 0813Z, the CG, CC "A", with the advance CP left TIDWORTH to join the 9th Infantry Regiment, 2d Infantry Division in the marshalling area at BARRY, WALES, arriving there at 1430Z. Remainder of the Combat Command at TIDWORTH.

2 June: Advance CP, CC "A" (5 off, 8 EM) left marshalling area at 0715Z and boarded SS CHARLES SUMNER (LT 206) docked at BARRY. Cast off at 1350Z and passed through locks, anchoring in the roads at 1530Z. Remainder of the Combat Command at TIDWORTH.

3 & 4 June: Advance CP on SS CHARLES SUMNER at anchor off BARRY, WALES. Remainder of Combat Command at TIDWORTH.

5 June: Advance CP on SS CHARLES SUMNER. At 0815Z moved west out of BRISTOL channel bound for rendezvous point off ISLE OF WIGHT via LANDS END. Remainder of Combat Command at TIDWORTH.

6 June: Advance CP on SS CHARLES SUMNER off south coast of England approaching SOUTHAMPTON. Elements of the Combat Command left TIDWORTH for the marshalling area starting at 0930Z. (Units marshalling at SOUTHAMPTON, LYMPINGTOM, PORTLAND.)

7 June: Advance CP on SUMNER anchored off coast of NORMANDY, vicinity of STE. HONORINE DES PERTES (T7287). Remainder of CC "A" elements in marshalling areas or at TIDWORTH. CG, CC "A"

left SUMNER without vehicles, at 1830B and set up forward CP on the beach near Hq. Prov. Eng. Brig. north of ST. LAURENT-SUR-MER at T676900Q. Establishing liaison with CG, V Corps.

8 June: Advance CP, CC"A" at T676900. Elements of CC"A" begin loading at 1200B at SOUTHAMPTON on LSTs and LCIs. Liaison maintained with CG, Vth Corps.

9 June: CP at T676900 awaiting arrival of elements of CC"A". Guides and CC"A" markers posted on routes to assembly area. Units landed starting at 1200B and dewaterproofed wherever possible, then proceeded to assembly area. All elements of Second Armored Division under command of CG, CC"A" pending arrival of CG, 2 AD. By 092400B the following elements of the command had unloaded and were in assembly vicinity MOSLES, FRANCE, (T7083), where CP opened 2000B, leaving rear CP on the beach.

10 June: Operations consisted of unloading and assembling the elements of the command. At 1130B, on order CG V Corps, the 3rd Bn 41st AIR (-) was attached to 29th Inf Div with the mission of securing the bridgehead on the west bank of the VIRE river, vicinity of AUVILLE-SUR-LE-VEY (T4684). Troops in position by 1700B. Rcn/66 sent patrols to south of CC"A" assembly area to contact friendly troops. Troops unloaded and under command of CG, CC"A" by 2200B:

11 June: 3/41 (-) attached to 29th Inf at T4684, patrolling to south and west. 82d Rcn patrolling to south of CC"A"

assembly area in contact with friendly troops. CG 2 AD and advance CP landed and took command. CC "A" reverting to normal composition. CG 2 AD assumed control of route markers from beach to assembly area. Units moved to new assembly area and CP, CC "A" opened at 1700B vicinity LE MARAIS (T6775) (less 3/41 (-) to rejoin CC "A" when released by V Corps). Operations of 3/41: Bn I & R platoon moved out at 1030B to reconnoiter south of RR in direction of MONTMARTIN-EN-GRAIGNES (T4681) in conjunction with a patrol from 101st A/B Div. Engaged by enemy MG fire, and 1 platoon H Co sent to their assistance. Estimated 15 enemy killed; 5 PWs taken identified from 4th Co, 915th Pz Gr Regt. Our losses: 1 Off & 1 EM killed.

12 June: CC "A" troops continued to unload and move to assembly. 3/41 detached from 19th Inf Div and returned under command CG, CC "A", closing in assembly area at 1400B.

13 June: In assembly vicinity LE MARAIS (T6775). At 0005B, CG CC "A" ordered by CG 2 AD to report to CG V Corps for orders. 3/41 and 2/66 alerted for movement, and moved out at 0315B toward ISIGNY, having been given the mission of securing the bridgehead west of town and cleaning out the Germans to the south thereof. Closed in assembly vicinity LES VEYS (T4683) at 0630B and patrols sent to the south toward the RH and MONTMARTIN (T4681) supported by fire from battleships NEVADA, and ARKANSAS. On order CG 1st US Army, mission was changed and this force attached to 101st A/B Div vicinity CARENTAN (T3984), remainder of CC "A" ordered by CG 2 AD to move and join forward elements in CARENTAN area, leaving assembly area at 1030B. Coordinated attack with 101st A/B Div at 1400B by 3/41 and 2/66, and by 1/66 and 101 A/B Div at 1730B, supported by 14th FA Bn. Enemy was driven back with heavy losses. CC "A" elements assembled for the night. Estimated enemy losses - 500 killed, 2 PWs taken. Our losses - Personnel - 2 Off & 6 EM killed, 6 Offs & 39 EM wounded, Tanks - 3 M4, 1 M5 (US), CP set up for the night SW of Town at T388635 in an abandoned house, A/SO securing ISIGNY bridgehead.

14 June: Attack continued at 0530B, and objectives secured by 0900B without resistance. Forward lines taken over by 101st A/B Div and CC "A" assembled south and west of CARENTAN, with elements of 2/66 east of town protecting the flank and bridgehead. Recon 66 patrolling left flank. All units searched respective areas for snipers. CP opened at 1000B at T369825. Platoon of Infantry and Tank platoon sent to reconnoiter toward LA RAYERIE (354818) to drive out infiltrating Germans, which was accomplished by 1800B and units returned to assembly. Our losses: 1 EM killed, 4 EM wounded.

15 June: Recon ordered by CG 1st Army to ascertain enemy strength along axis CARENTAN-PERIER. CG CC "A" assigned mission to following troops: Recon Co, 66th AR supported by one tank company, one Infantry company and 14th FA Bn, crossed LD at 0650B and ran into heavy MG and small arms fire at once. Held up by AT guns at 0715B. Elements of 3/41 and 1/66 sent to push recon forward; troops moved to vicinity of T359800 and upon order CG CC "A" withdrew having ascertained

that the enemy was holding in force. Front lines taken over by 101st A/B and troops reassembled for the night. Enemy losses - unestimated. Our losses - Personnel - 9 EM killed, 4 Offs & 27 EM wounded, 1 Off & 6 EM missing. Vehicles - 1 Assault Gun, 1 Armored Car (US) lost.

16 June: Patrolling to south by Rcn/66. Other units in assembly.

17 June: Detached from 101st A/B except 1st Bn 66th AR and CC "A" moved out starting at 0500B returning to the assembly area vicinity LE MARAIS. CP CC "A" opened at 677751 at 0915B. Maintenance of equipment and personnel.

18 June - 30 June. In assembly vicinity LE MARAIS (T6775) 1st Bn 66th AR attached to 101st A/B Div in CALEMANT area until 28 June; then attached to 83rd Inf Div same area. Rcn/66 established listening posts and patrols to the south of assembly area. Alert force set up in case of counterattack. Training conducted with emphasis on hedgerow type of tank-infantry-artillery coordination. Maintenance of men and equipment. CP CC "A" opened at LA CHAUMINERIE (T694755) at 221100B.

SUBJECT: Operations Report for Period July 1 - 31 inclusive.

TO : Commanding General, 2d Armored Division (ATTEN: AG of S, G-3)

MAPS: FRANCE 1/100,000, Sheet: ST LO, VIRE 6F.

Combat Command "A", 2d Armored Division was located in assembly area near LA CATHERINERIE (T694755), on July 1, 1944 and was engaged in conducting reconnaissance and liaison to the SOUTHEAST in preparation for take-over of the line on the extreme left of the First United States Army. The line then held by the British 7th Armored Division. At 1230B the Combat Command with the 2d Bn, 41st AIR attached, moved by infiltration from the assembly area near LA CATHERINERIE to an area generally located NORTHEAST of CAUMONT (T729639). 2d and 3rd Bns, 41st AIR upon arrival took over from reserve companies of the 7th and 5th Queens Regiments, remainder of relief of these regiments was effected by 0300B, 2 July, 1944. The Infantry took steps to secure their defensive positions and registered in artillery and mortars. Engineers prepared routes by bulldozer so that the Combat Command could meet a counterattack in any direction. Contact was made with CO "B" (1st Bn, 41st AIR) on our right and with the 56th Brigade (British 2d Glosters) on our left. Enemy activity in that sector was quiet.

A patrol from 2d Bn, 41st AIR started at 1110B 2 July 1944 to move to the town of ERIGUSSARD (T740597). This town consisted of about ten houses and was located to the front of the 2d Bn, 41st AIR and was reported by the British to be well defended. The patrol received fire short of town and withdrew without loss.

At 022330B July 44, a patrol from Rcn Co, 66th AR left our lines and penetrated to T749610, where they located six trip wires leading from edge of orchard across an open field. They withdrew when our friendly artillery fired on the town and returned through our lines at 030530B July 44. 3rd Bn, 41st AIR sent a patrol consisting of 1 Officer and 20 EM through our lines 030800B and penetrated to the northern edge of town of EQUEET (T751609), at which point they were fired on by machine gun, small arms and mortar fire. One EM was wounded. Patrol returned fire and attempted to maneuver but this failed due to volume of enemy fire and the openness of the terrain at this point. Another EM was wounded and it is believed the officer in command was wounded before the patrol could disengage, as he did not return with the patrol. A four man patrol returned before darkness to the spot where the officer was believed wounded and found booby traps and trip wires. They returned without further incident. Enemy known casualties, 1 killed and 2 wounded. The action of this patrol was supported by artillery and mortar fire. Enemy attitude all along Combat Command sector appeared to be to resist any advance by our patrols.

On 4 July 1944, and 5 July 1944, patrolling was carried on by the two infantry battalions and no identifications were received. CP at this time located at T747639. Both battalions of infantry following a rotation plan, relieved one of their line companies with a reserve company. Infantry mortars fired at targets of opportunity, throughout this period. Mortar platoon, 3rd Bn, 66th AR moved into position where they could fire and laid fire on town of EQUEET. 14th AFA Bn fired harrassing and defensive fires during the night 4 July and day 5 July 1944. Air observers were used to great advantage. Co A, 17th Eng Bn worked to improve tank trails in Combat Command area so as to facilitate movement to meet possible enemy attack from SOUTHEAST, SOUTH or SOUTHWEST.

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Enemy laid harrassing artillery fire on 2d Bn, 41st AIR during the afternoon of July 6 1944. 2 EM were killed and 4 EM wounded. Co A, 17th Eng Bn completed laying of minefields in front of 3rd Bn, 41st AIR sector at 2100B. The 2d Bn, 41st AIR sent a small reconnaissance patrol along the OPLR on the morning of July 7 and ran into small arms, machine gun fire and grenades. After exchanging fire through the hedgerows, they withdrew. A combat patrol from the 2d Bn, 41st AIR returned on July 8 to the same location the patrol from the previous day had received fire and attempted to extend the OPL, but met stubborn resistance and withdrew. Co E, 41st AIR relieved Co D, 41st AIR in the 2d Bn sector. At 2030B, 8 July 1944, enemy counterattacked against the 2d SWB (Br). Change in disposition of troops was made so as to give assistance to the British if necessary and to protect the left flank of the Combat Command. No change was made in the infantry defensive sector, nor was any change made in the troops that were to give them supporting fires.

All secure on 2d and 3rd Bn, 41st AIR front on 9 July 1944. Spasmodic harrassing fire from the enemy. Ron Plat, 3rd Bn, 66th AR reconnoitered routes, contacted British elements and reported information obtained from the British sector to this headquarters.

High ground from FORTINHALL to LA RUE DE POURFOIR was reconnoitered for positions in event of enemy counterattack. Prepared to move on order of CG, 2d Arm'd Div was the 3rd Bn, 66th AR and Co A, 17th Eng Bn to the EAST or SOUTHEAST to meet an enemy threat in the British sector.

From the period of July 10 to July 16, both 2d and 3rd Bns, 41st AIR received periodic harrassing artillery and mortar fire. Ron Plat, 66th AR maintained close liaison with the British on our left and conducted reconnaissance of area for routes and positions in the event the Combat Command would have to move to this sector to meet any enemy threat. 14th AFA Bn fired counterbattery harrassing and defensive artillery fires during this period and the cub liaison plan proved again to be invaluable. On July 10, 3rd Bn, 41st AIR replaced Co G in the line with Co I, and on July 11, this same battalion engaged area targets with 81mm mortar and assault guns. The 14th AFA Bn, supported the attack of the British 131st Brigade from 0700B to 0735B on 11 July. Light tank personnel of the 66th AR began training in the Medium Tank, M4A1 on 12 July. Co D, 41st AIR replaced Co F in the line on July 13. At 1200B, 10 enemy planes strafed the two infantry battalions and from approximately 1230B to 1330B, enemy harrassing artillery fire fell in the 14th AFA Bn, Ron Co, 66th AR and the Hq CC"A", CP area. Entire Combat Command conducted a showdown of individual equipment at this time. On July 14th, enemy shelled the CP and A Btry of the 14th AFA Bn. 0920B, Btry C, 14th AFA Bn moved to T745625. On July 16, all units of CC"A" prepared to turnover of sector to relieving unit, 8th Armored Brigade (Br), 50th Division (Br), and prepared for movement to new area.

By 2010D 17 July, CC"A" had been relieved of its defensive sector by the 8th Arm'd Brigade (Br) and had closed in its new assembly area vicinity LA CATHARINIERIE. The move made in two groups, 66th AR, D Btry, 195 AAA Bn, Co A, 17th Eng Bn, Co A, 48th Med Bn, and Rear CP, CC"A" being in the first group, 2d and 3rd Bns, 41st AIR, 14th AFA Bn and Ron Co, 66th AR comprising the second group which moved to new Combat Command assembly area upon being relieved, and closed in that area at 0525B 18 July 1944. The two battalions of infantry reverted to regimental control upon closing in the new area. During the period from July 19 to July 26, units of Combat Command "A" followed a schedule which included care and cleaning of weapons and vehicles and personal equipment. 66th AR fired new medium tanks, M4A1 with 76mm gun and camouflage painting of all full-track vehicles was accomplished.

This period was high-lighted by the attachment of the 22d RCT (4th Inf Div) to CC"A", effective 1200B July 19, and their movement into the Combat Command assembly area at 182200B July 44. CP of the 22d RCT was located at T793740. At the same time, the 702d TD Bn (-1 Co), Co C, 17th Eng Bn and Co A, Maint Bn, 2d Armored Division were also attached. The air support party, consisting of 1 officer and 4 EMs and 1 Medium Tank were attached to CC"A" from the 9th TAC. For the next few days following the attachment to CC"A", the infantry of the 22d RCT trained in combined tank-infantry demonstrations and practical work with the 66th AR. Plans were laid and FO #4, covering operations "COBRA" was drawn up on July 20, 1944. This field order called for the movement of CC"A" upon order of CC, 2d Armored Division on two routes, to seize initially the area LE MESNIL (T4555) - ST SAUVEUR EN BOIS FOSSE (T4655) - Hill 183 (T4353) and to cover the movement of the 1st Infantry Division and the 3rd Armored Division through the MARIGNY - ST GILLES gap, prepared to attack enemy forces approaching from the EAST and SOUTH between COUDRE SUR VIRE (T5042) and HAMBIE (T3645). For this move, 32d Rec Bn and 24th Cavalry Squadron moved under control of CC"A". On the 22d of July, entire Combat Command with attachments was alerted for movement on two hours notice, however at 1100B 25 July this status was changed to alert for movement on instant notice. At 1700B this same day, Combat Command on order reverted again to two hour alert status. At 1800B, CC"A" was alerted for movement to assembly area SUD of PONT HERBERT (T4769) on order. At 2230B, CC"A" began march in one column to assembly area, vicinity PONT HERBERT and closed into assembly area at 260200B July 44. Unit Commanders reported to CP, CC"A" immediately upon arrival and received verbal orders for the attack. Plan of attack was changed following the information received by combat commander from the forward elements on the ground, and as the plan now stood, the Combat Command would attack with two battalions attacking abreast astride the road. 2d Bn, 66th AR on the right, 3rd Bn, 66th AR on the left, 2 Infantry companies from the 22d RCT with each battalion. The six remaining rifle companies of the 22d RCT would follow 1st Bn, 66th AR. Six battalions of artillery would support entire action of the Combat Command.

CC"A" jumped off in the attack 260900B July 1944 with line of battalions from the LD following; the exits previously designated in FO #4 to the indicated objective. Stubborn and heavy resistance was met throughout the day in the form of Mark V tanks supported by infantry and artillery and AT guns along the roads. At approximately 1500B 26 July 1944, CC"A" reverted to original orders (FO #4) and proceeded to objective in two columns over route as planned. At 270200B the Combat Command reached and consolidated its objective and unit commanders reported to the CP, CC"A" for a unit commanders meeting. During the morning of 27 July 1944, MESNIL SUR VIRE was secured and mopped up by 2d Bn, 66th AR and Hill 183 occupied and secured by 22d RCT. 702d TD Bn was ordered to move as soon as possible to selected areas in that vicinity to set up road blocks. 22d RCT was to beat the bushes for snipers and German patrols and to generally clean up the area. Rec Co, 66th AR to prepare outposts. The remainder of the Combat Command was ordered into an assembly area awaiting further orders.

At 271600B July 1944, reconnaissance in force moved out in two columns along route LE MUS IL MELAN - VILLEBALDON - LA LANDE - TESSY SUR VIRE. West column's furthest point of advance at 2100B was T500445. East column's furthest point of advance at 2100B was T516578. At 2307B, Unit Commanders assembled at CP, CC"A" for meeting and orders for 28 July were issued. The two task forces previously designated were to move at 0530B along the same routes that had been laid down in prior orders, organize ground and hold it. At 280200B July 1944, CC"A" was notified of the attachment of the 113th Cavalry Group and ordered to provide guides for that attachment into the Combat Command assembly area. CC"A" was to be detached from 2d Armored Division and operate directly under XIX Corps.

24th Cavalry Squadron was attached to 113th Cavalry Group. Orders were issued for Combat Command to delay its attack until 1500B, at which time it would advance and secure Corps objective, generally PERCY - High ground SOUTH of LA CHEFRESNE - ST MARIE - VILLEBAUDON which was already secured. 1st Bn, 66th AR on the left was to by-pass any resistance at TESSY - SUR - VIRE and push on to Corps objective. When the Corps objective was secured, the Combat Command moved forward to an assembly area immediately in rear of Corps objective. 113th Cavalry Group after reaching Corps objective conducted reconnaissance to the SOUTH, WEST and EAST to contact the enemy and protect EAST and WEST flank of the Combat Command. Three task forces were set up and all tanks reverted to their parent organization, while the remainder of the 22d RCT was moved forward as a unit.

On 29 July 1944, Combat Command continued its move to the SOUTH in order to secure newly assigned Corps objective along the route VILLEBAUDON - PERCY - MONTERAY - ST SEVER CALVADOS - ST POIS. The force attacking PERCY terminated its attack at 2150B. Another force launched its second attack in the area NORTH of VILLEBAUDON to the EAST, after dissipating what appeared to be a counterattack forming up, consisting of tanks reported as Mark Vs, armored cars and infantry in the general vicinity of T434427. The remainder of the Combat Command remained in reserve in an area between VILLEBAUDON and a point about 2 miles NORTH of that town. All Combat Command artillery supported the action of the two forces. Advance CP of the Combat Command at VILLEBAUDON throughout the day and moved at night with entire CP to T433466. VILLEBAUDON and the road between that town and PERCY were under fire from anti-tank guns and artillery. From time to time it was observed that enemy was infiltration across the road from EAST to WEST between VILLEBAUDON and PERCY. Hasty enemy road blocks with some anti-tank guns were set up along this road.

On the 31st of July, CC"A" was attached to the 29th Infantry Division and was given a new mission, that of supporting the infantry now engaged in securing left flank of the Corps. Mission of the 29th Infantry Division was to attack to the EAST toward TESSY-SUR-VIRE, seizing the high ground vicinity T495465.

SUBJECT: Notice against the Enemy, Report After/After Action Report.

TO : Commanding General, 2d Armored Division, (ATTN: AB or S, G-1.)

The operations of Combat Command "A" for the month of August 1944 can be divided into four phases. The advance from VILLEBON to VIRE, the attack through GATHEN to SEZI, the march from LOCHY EN PERIGNE to BLANGUIN and finally the drive which started at MANTES GARGOUIL and carried across the SEINE River and into ST. LÔ. Each of these phases was preceded by a movement of the Combat Command into an assembly area as shown on the overlay.

At 0630H 1 August 1944, Combat Command "A", consisting of 66th AR, 14th APA Bn, 702d TD Bn, 2nd REGT, Co A, 17th Eng Bn and Co A, 49th Med Bn, pushed off to support the attack of the 29th Infantry Division from the location vicinity VILLEBON (74346) to secure TRESSE-SUR-VIRE (76267). The 3rd Bn, 66th AR, after meeting fierce enemy resistance and strong delaying action throughout the whole of the day, and having had their column cut at least twice, moved in and secured TRESSE-SUR-VIRE in the late afternoon of the same day.

On XII Corps order, the Combat Command on 3 August 1944 moved SOUTH along prescribed route in the direction of VIRE to protect the left flank of the Corps and with the mission of seizing the road junction at 76266 and Hill 218, then continuing on to the Corps objective, which was the high ground generally SOUTH of VIRE. At 040000H the Combat Command stopped off and met no resistance for the first 8000 yards. Remainder of the day frequent minefields were encountered extending across the road, and the resistance consisted of stubborn delaying action of tanks and infantry supported by artillery with some AT guns. The column was held up at 1730H at a stream crossing two miles WEST of the initial objective. On the 8th of August, CG "A" received a new Corps objective, which called for a continuation of the original mission and further movement to the SOUTH to seize the town of BUREGNY. Combat Command Artillery supported by Corps Artillery shelled VIRE heavily during the night. August 8 found the 1st Bn, 66th AR with the 3rd Bn, 116th Infantry Regt occupying BUREGNY and 2d Bn, 66th AR astride the road at 7614340. In that day, Colonel John H. Collier assumed control of the Combat Command.

The Combat Command was placed in Corps Reserve 7 August 1944, and during that day and the day following, as much maintenance was done as was possible considering the proximity of the enemy. Task Force "A", consisting of 2d Bn, 66th AR, 14th APA Bn, 1 Plat, Co A, 17th Eng Bn, 2d Bn, 41st AM (-1 Co), 1 Co, 702d TD Bn, Detachment Co A, 49th Med Bn, was organised and given the mission per letter of instruction XII Corps. On 10 August, TF "A", attacked from vicinity GATHEN, EAST along the ridge line to secure Hill 257. The advance was slow over difficult terrain and TF "A" knocked out numerous anti-tank guns with artillery and considerable infantry. 1st Bn, 66th AR was attached to the 29th Infantry Division until darkness of the same day.

At 2320H August 11, remainder of Combat Command "A" was put on one hour alert status to join TF "A". The Combat Command remained in the same status until 121512H August 1944 when they were put on instant notice for immediate movement. CG "A" (-2d Bn, 66th AR) moved out in the attack at 130700H.

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along the route BAGNOLS - SCOURVAL - ST CLEMENT - BAGNOLS - GEM. Upon joining 2d Armored Division, Combat Command "A" passed under its control. On the 14th of August, CC "A" consisting of attack unit was given the mission of seizing and securing Hill 389. CC "A" met numerous anti-tank guns and some light artillery. Upon completion of this mission on 15 August 1944, CC "A" pulled back at first light to new assembly area SOUTHEAST of BAGNOLS. Combat Command "A" consisting of Tq Co "A", 68th AR, 14th ADA Bn, 2d Bn, 41st AR and Co A, 48th Med Bn; all other units having reverted to parent organizations. On the 16th and 17th of August, entire CC "A" was devoted to maintenance of vehicles, weapons and rehabilitation of personnel.

CC "A" marched from assembly area SOUTHEAST of BAGNOLS, beginning at 180745B August 1944 over the route ST PATRICK, GARRON, AMBERTESLE GRAND, JAVRON and SHES, thence SOUTHEAST to new assembly area SOUTHEAST of SHES. The following day the Combat Command again moved from assembly area SOUTHEAST of SHES to new assembly area WEST of LOONY DU PARC. Movement began at 191045B August 1944 and was completed at 191200B August 1944.

On 20 August 1944, CC "A" began advance that continued through 26 August and carried them over a route generally NORTH - NORTHEAST from their assembly area through DAMVILLE then almost due NORTH to ELCHEV. During this advance three successive streams were bridged against stiff resistance in the form of infantry and AT guns, and nearing the end of the drive, long range medium artillery was received. The enemy bombed the CP of CC "A" and units of the Combat Command on the road during the night of 23 August 1944. On 24 August the 99th Separate Infantry Bn was attached to CC "A", and together with the 2d Bn, 41st AR drove on ELCHEV from the SOUTHEAST. The 2d Bn, 68th AR assisted the 109th Infantry Regiment (38th Infantry Division) on securing ELCHEV from the EAST. The town was secured and turned over to the 7th Canadian Infantry Brigade on 261845B August 44.

Starting at 271815B, CC "A" moved to assembly area vicinity MANTES GASSICOURT from which it moved out at 300630B, crossing the SEINE River and advancing rapidly in a NORTHEASTERLY direction, bypassing such resistance as the advance guard could not eliminate.

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

PERIOD 1 - 30 SEPTEMBER

The close of the month of August had found the Combat Command "A", 2d Armored Division, after crossing the SEINE River in the vicinity of MANTES-CASSICOURT, FRANCE, advancing in a NORTHEASTERLY direction toward BELGIUM. Resistance was light and the advance was rapid. Combat Command "A" at that time consisted:

66th Armored Regiment (-1/66*)
2d Bn, 41st AIR
14th AFA Bn
65th AFA Bn
Btry D, 196th AAA Bn (AW) SP
Co A, 17th Engr Bn
Co A, 702d TD Bn
Co A, 48th Med Bn
(*1/66 at that time was in Div Res)

In the morning of the 1st September, the Combat Command moved out in two columns from an assembly area, vicinity MONTDIDIER, to secure a crossing of the OISE River and continue with its drive to the NORTHEAST. The left column was composed of:

Hq 66th Armored Regiment
3rd Bn, 66th AR (-1 Co)
1 Co, 2d Bn, 41st AIR
1 Plat, Co A, 17th Engr Bn
1 Plat, Co A, 702d TD Bn

The remainder of the Combat Command moved in the right column. 14th AFA Bn, 65th AFA Bn were reinforced by the 55th AFA Bn, supported the action of both columns from the right column. In the subsequent days, the 65th AFA Bn directly supported and traveled with the left column.

NOV 2 1944

Strong, fan-shaped resistance curtailed the advance of the Combat Command far more than the fan-shaped resistance that was met during this period.

After bypassing and crossing the ARRAS-CAMERAI road in the late afternoon of 30 October, the Combat Command coiled and outposted both columns for the night, to proceed in the same direction the following day.

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On 010941 September 1944, CC"A" entered BELGIUM and assembled in an area across the FRANC-BELGIAN frontier, astride the ORCHIES-TOURNAI road. During this drive enemy units, attempting to escape, tried to break through from the WEST while the CC"A" columns were heading for the BELGIAN border. These units, which included 2 Mark V tanks, 9 towed AT guns and approximately 170 vehicles were engaged by our tanks and artillery and destroyed. 450 prisoners were taken during this engagement, and the Combat Command "A" had the distinction of being the first Allied column to enter BELGIUM. Road blocks were set up and CC"A" was prepared to defend the position from any direction; though at that time, attention was focused on the WEST as it was expected enemy groups would be attempting to force their way through and rejoin their own forces already withdrawing to the EAST. As it happened, small groups of men were picked up from time to time, attempting to infiltrate through from the WEST, but never in any sizeable force after CC"A" had once set up in a defensive position.

On the 4th of September, the entire Combat Command shifted to an assigned area SOUTHEAST of ORCHIES-TOURNAI road to conform with the agreed boundary between the British Second Army and the American First Army. It was at this time that the British Guards' Armored Division passed NORTHEAST on the way to BRUSSELS.

Again, pushing out in two columns on 6 September, CC"A" began its march EASTWARD, meeting scattered enemy opposition. Prime concern at this time, as before, was gasoline. The policy as laid down by the Combat Commander was to move as far as possible and still have ten operational miles left when the vehicles were halted for the day. 7th and 8th September found CC"A" continuing its march each day, but moving more to the NORTHEAST and halting for the night in areas as shown on the overlay. The afternoon of the 8th, the Combat Command bivouaced in an area between WEST and HASSELT.

From 8th September to the 12th September, units of CC"A" spent their time ensuring that their areas and adjacent areas were cleared of the enemy, and when this was completed, all personnel concentrated on maintenance of weapons and vehicles.

82d Arm'd Regt Bn was attached on 12th September and CC"A" took over their mission; that is, of clearing enemy from the Division Zone NORTH of the ALBERT Canal. After receiving these orders, the CP moved out in the late afternoon and crossed the ALBERT Canal over a previously constructed treadway crossing at 1275665. The 2d Bn, 41st AIR preceded the Combat Command across the canal and halted for the night astride the road NORTH out of HASSELT (see overlay). At this time, all elements of the 82d Arm't Bn were on the EAST side of the ALBERT Canal.

The Army's action in this area had been to hold and fight a delaying action in the area NORTH of the ALBERT Canal from HASSELT to MAASTRICHT on the MAAS River. Enemy units in this area were assort and unorganized. New identifications included men with physical defects which under ordinary circumstances would have classified them as limited service. These battalions were poorly armed and artillery supporting these units was of ancient vintage. Morale was generally low.

On the 13th of September 44 CC"A" attacked to the EAST in two columns, the 2d Bn, 41st AIR (-1 Co), with Co G, 66th AR attached, forming the right column and moving SOUTH from their location, which was the extent of the advance of the previous day. The 3rd Bn, 66th AR (-1 Co) with D Co, 41st AIR attached constituted the left column by moving across the canal following the route the overlay shows.

and attacking to the EAST. The mission given to the 82d Arm'd Ron Bn consisted of continuing reconnaissance to the front, maintaining contact with the British on the left, and the remainder of the battalion to be used to clear the area between the columns. Resistance encountered was in the form of infantry, anti-tank guns, and road blocks of trees blown across the road and wired with booby traps. Due to the soft ground the tanks were road bound and this presented a serious problem. Two slag piles located to the front and EAST of the left column overlooked their advance and furnished the enemy with good observation. Both columns however reached the "NORTH-SOUTH" railroad through the town of BERG by darkness, and the infantry set up a defense. At that time the 99th Separate Infantry Battalion was attached and in turn was put under the control of the CO, 66th AR, who took command of the left column. Co D, 41st AIR reverted to 2d Bn, 41st AIR at this time.

The morning of the 14th September both columns as previously constituted attacked EAST (the right column turning to the SOUTHEAST) and met scattered resistance, but delayed mostly by the size of the areas necessary to comb and clean out. 82d Ron Bn protected left flank of CC"A", maintained contact between CC"A" columns and cleared the areas between the columns.

The middle column operated for a short while when the 2d Bn, 66th AR was sent on a parallel road to expedite the advance of the right column. However, shortly after this they rejoined the right column.

CC"A" bivouaced for the night as shown on the overlay and spent 15 September finishing mopping up the area within the Division zone WEST of MAASTRICHT Canal. 1st Bn, 66th AR was attached to CC"A" from Division Reserve 15 September 44. At time of attachment 1st Bn, 66th AR was in an assembly area W of MAASTRICHT.

66th AR (-1st, 2d Bns, Ron & Maint Cos), 99th Separate Infantry Bn, 65th AFA Bn and 82d Ron Bn under the control of CO, 66th AR were detached from CC"A" on 16 September 44 and remained in this area with the mission of attacking to the NORTH, including the area WEST of the MAAS River.

Combat Command "A" organized and moved out on 16 September with three task forces composed as follows:

Task Force A: 2/66 AR (-1 Co), D/41 AIR, 1 Plat A/17 Engr Bn, 1 Plat A/702 Td Bn
Task Force B: 2/41 AIR (-2 Cos), 1 Co Med Tank 2/66 AR
Task Force C: 1/66 AR, Co F 2/41 AIR, 1 Plat A/17 Engr Bn, 1 Plat A/702 Td Bn

Though organized in three task forces, the Combat Command moved through MAASTRICHT, along the route as shown on the overlay, in a single column. 1st Bn, 66th AR joined column at MAASTRICHT.

As a stream crossing at VALKENBURG was strongly defended and supported by artillery fire, and the 2d Bn, 41st AIR in conjunction with 2d Bn, 117th Inf, 30th Inf Div was engaged in securing that crossing most of 17th September, the remainder of the Combat Command went to a forward assembly area near SIEBE, just SOUTH of VALKENBURG. The 2d Bn, 41st AIR was complete at this time; the two previously detached rifle companies having been returned to its control. At the earliest opportunity, the tanks were sent across, and late in the afternoon of 17th September the CP was moved into VALKENBURG. After crossing the two tank battalions the task

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Task Force B on the right,
forces listed above were reconstituted Task Force A in the center, and Task Force C on the left, continued on to the NORTHEAST.

The Combat Command was given the objective on the 18th of September of securing the main road between GANGELET (X7867) and GIELENKIRCHEN (X8664). Task Force A and C continued their attack and Task Force B (2d Bn, 41st AIR) attacked to the EAST and NORTHEAST forming the extreme right column. The 65th AFA Bn was reassigned and joined. By darkness on the 19th of September, CC "A" had accomplished its mission in spite of fierce resistance and heavy artillery fire. The GANGELET-GIELENKIRCHEN road was secured as far EAST as GILRATH. With the mission of protecting the left (NORTH) flank of XII Corps, the Combat Command set up a strong defense and shortly after pulling into this area the enemy launched a strong counterattack with a battalion of infantry from the 343rd Infantry Regiment and 8 self-propelled guns supported by artillery. By that time, 1st Bn, 56th AR had established an "all-around defense" at GILRATH and the 2d Bn, 66th AR was moving into NIERSTRASS and onto the high ground to the EAST of there. The 14th AFA Air OP spotted the counterattack developing and by frequent reporting of the enemy's location guided the tanks of the 2d Bn, 66th AR around so they could hit the counterattacking force in the flank and rear. Seven of the SP guns were definitely knocked out and heavy losses were inflicted on the completely disrupted enemy infantry.

During this advance and the days following through the 19th of September, the Combat Command captured 1119 prisoners and killed approximately 700. Vehicles destroyed included 7 Mark IV and Mark Vs, 52 vehicles, 19 towed anti-tank guns and 21 artillery pieces.

Combat Command "A" held this defense facing NORTH and the SIEGFRIED Line to the EAST from 19 September through the end of the month. The original mobile defense plan (extending in a semi-circle SOUTH on one side and WEST on the other) around the town of GILRATH, once established, was maintained throughout this defensive period. All defensive fires and supporting weapons were registered in, and both field-artillery battalions of CC "A" fired harassing and interdictory fires on the critical points and possible enemy assembly areas in front of the positions. The engineers laid mines and booby traps across the possible avenues of approach. Frequent patrols were sent out both day and night, although during the former the patrols received heavy artillery fire which limited their reconnaissance to a minimum.

Enemy action during the remainder of this period until 30 September limited to defensive fires from artillery and small arms. A considerable number of enemy deserters surrendered during this period. Total prisoners taken - 67, killed approximately 229, destroyed 22 vehicles and 12 assault guns. Identifications included 176 Infantry Division and 183rd Infantry Division (Folks Grenadiers).

On 21 September the CP moved to a more central location and the 702d TD Bn (-2 Companies) was attached to CC "A". No material change was effected in defensive dispositions until the 22d of September when the 1st Bn, 41st AIR was attached to CC "A". This battalion was placed in the line in the GILRATH-NIERSTRASS sector, strengthening that sector.

Combat Command "A" formulated plans on the 29th of September for the part they would play in the exploitation of a "breakthrough" in the SIEGFRIED Line, and prepared for a turn-over of their defensive responsibility. The 702d TD Bn (-3 Cos) was relieved from CC "A" on that day.

The 66th AFA Bn, the 1st Bn, 41st AIR and Co C, 17th Engr Bn were detached from CC "A" on 30th September and reconnaissance was made for new assembly areas for units of the Combat Command.

At 2200 on 30 September 1944, Combat Command "A" was relieved of this defensive sector by the 115th Infantry Regiment.

At 002200A September 1944 CC"A", 2d Arm'd Div was relieved from holding the line GANGELT (exclusive) - GILRATH - NIERSTRASS - TEVERN by 115th RCT, 29th Division. During the morning 1 Oct 44 the Combat Command moved to an assembly area in rear of the front line vicinity of K753633 (see overlay No. 1 attached) out of contact with the enemy. The troop list of CC"A" on 1 Oct 44 was as follows:

FO #29 covering the operations plan of CC"A" for its assigned phase of the forthcoming breaching of the SIEGFRIED LINE was issued to all units on 1 Oct 44. The mission of CC"A" for this operation was to follow CC"B", 2d Armored Division in two columns through breach in the SIEGFRIED LINE created by 30th Inf Div, clear enemy from area in its zone, and secure division objective E of ROER River in zone. The composition of the two CC"A" columns was initially designated as follows;

D-Day for the operation was initially set as 1 Oct 44, dependent upon weather conditions and availability of air support for the saturation bombing scheduled to precede the attack on the SIEGFRIED LINE by the 30th Inf Div. Because of unfavorable weather for air operations on 1 Oct 44, D-Day was postponed until 2 Oct 44. From 020300A to 021100A Oct 44, medium and fighter bombers bombed the target area but the effect of the bombing was not good because of the overcast. The 30th Inf Div launched its attack following the bombing. Enemy resistance was extremely heavy and progress was slow. CC"B", 2d Arm'd Div moved 3 Oct 44 into the partial breach in the SIEGFRIED LINE made by the 30th Inf Div and passed through their forward elements, attacking N and NE.

CC"A" remained in assembly area until 5 Oct 44 prepared to move on order CG, 2d Arm'd Div. The period 1-4 Oct 44 was devoted to maintenance of vehicles and weapons, reconnaissance of routes from assembly area to bridge sites over WURM River, and detailed briefing of personnel preparatory to the operation. At 041500A Oct 44, 2d Bn, 41st AIR was detached from CC"A" and attached to CC"B" and moved to reinforce CC"B" elements E of WURM River. At 041830A 3rd Bn, 116th Inf Regt, 29th Inf Div was attached to CC"A". This battalion moved from its bivouac area vicinity VALKENBURG, HOLLAND into CC"A" assembly area morning of 5 Oct 44, closing in area at 1000A. Upon arrival 3rd Bn, 116th Inf (-1 Co) was attached to Left Column (66th AR (-)reinf). One company was attached to Right Column (1st Bn, 66th AR reinf).

65th APA Bn was attached to CC"A" on afternoon 4 Oct 44, remaining in firing position under Div Arty control.

5 Oct 44

Effective 051000A Oct 44 CC"A" was placed on a 30 minute alert for movement in one column over the bridge at PALENBURG. At 1030A orders were received from CG, 2d Arm'd Div for head of CC"A" column to arrive at PALENBURG Bridge at 1300A. Prior to movement CC"A" plans were changed as follows: To move from assembly area to PALENBURG Bridge in one column instead of two, order of march, Left Column, Right Column. Composition of columns was changed to be as follows.

66th AR (-) reinf (Left Column) moved out at 1145A, crossed PALENBURG bridge, passed through elements of 30th Inf Div and CC"B", 2d Arm'd Div E of WURM River and advanced to a point 1000 yds E of UBACH by dark 5 Oct 1944 (see overlay No 2 attached). Throughout the day the PALENBURG bridge and the town of UBACH were under heavy German artillery fire. 1st Bn, 66th AR reinf (Right Column) moved forward to a new assembly area W of WURM River in the afternoon, prepared to cross PALENBURG bridge on order. (See overlay No 2 for dispositions of CC"A" elements as of dark 5 Oct 44.) Late in the afternoon Colonel Ira P. Swift reported for duty as Commanding Officer, 66th AR and was placed in command of the Left Column. Btry B, 14th AFA Bn displaced to a firing position E of WURM River late in the afternoon.

6 Oct 44

66th AR (-) reinf continued the attack to the E at 060700A Oct 44. Co D, 66th AR with one company 116th Inf attached under command of Lt Col Stokes advanced and secured the town of BEGGENDORF. The remainder of the force advanced to a position just S of the KARL ALEXANDER Mine W of BAESWEILER.

1st Bn, 66th AR reinf began crossing PALENBURG bridge at 1300A and moved into an assembly area 1000 yards E of UBACH. Upon closing in assembly area, Company I, 66th AR with two platoons Co I, 116th Inf attached advanced to the high ground vicinity K882572 and contacted tank elements of 30th Inf Div on their right.

14th AFA Bn displaced remaining batteries into firing positions E of WURM River and other CC"A" elements moved forward to new assembly areas in vicinity GROtenRATH prepared to cross WURM River on order.

One platoon Co C, 702d TD Bn was attached to CC"A" and in turn attached to Rcn Co, 66th AR.

(See overlay #3 for dispositions of elements E of WURM River as of dark 6 October 1944.)

7 Oct 44

Rcn Co, 66th AR with 1 Plat Co C, 702d TD Bn attached crossed PALENBURG bridge at 0630A and moved into BEGGENDORF relieving Co G, 66th AR reinf from the mission of securing the town. This relief was completed at 0900A.

66th AR (-) reinf attacked BAESWEILER at 0700A, moving into the town from the NW with the force at the KARL ALEXANDER Mine and from the N with Co G, 66th AR reinf. BAESWEILER was cleared of the enemy and secured at 1500A.

1st Bn, 66th AR reinf attacked at 0700A with the mission of seizing and securing OIDTWEILER and utilizing Co I, 66th AR w/l Plat Co I, 116th Inf attached to seize high ground NW of ALSDORF and from that position support the attack of the 30th Inf Div on ALSDORF. Co I, 66th AR reinf, moving abreast and on left of tank elements of 30th Inf Div occupied the designated high ground without opposition. The battalion less Co I and attached infantry was held up just W of the ALSDORF-OIDTWEILER road by very heavy German artillery fire and AT fire covering the AT ditch from the W edge of OIDTWEILER.

65th AFA Bn displaced to firing positions E of WURM River.

Co A, 82d Ron Bn was attached to CC"A" afternoon 7 Oct 44 and in turn attached to 1st Bn, 66th AR reinf.

8 Oct 44

1st Bn, 66th AR reinf continued the attack to seize and secure OIDTWEILER at 0745A reinforced by 2d Bn, 66th AR (-2 Cos). 1st Bn moved into the town from W and 2d Bn (-) moved into the town from the N from BAESWEILER. Co I, 66th AR moved to a position across the ALSDORF-OIDTWEILER ROAD and S of OIDTWEILER covering the southern edge of OIDTWEILER by fire. OIDTWEILER was secured at 1500A. An additional platoon Co A, 702d TD Bn was attached to 1st Bn, 66th AR reinf effective at 1300A to reinforce the AT defense in OIDTWEILER Sector.

At 1500A Co D, 82d Ron Bn was attached to CC"A" and placed in BAESWEILER in CC"A" Reserve. At 1830A Co H, 66th AR was attached to CC"A" and closed in assembly area vicinity K884582 in CC"A" Reserve.

At 1700A 1 Plat Co I, 66th AR was detached from 1st Bn, 66th AR reinf and attached to 117th Inf RCT, 30th Inf Div to assist that unit in its attack on SCHAFENBERG. This platoon reverted to 1st Bn, 66th AR reinf at 2000A.

At dark 8 Oct 44, CC"A" had secured the line BEGGENDORF - BAESWEILER - OIDTWEILER - ALSDORF (exclusive) and its mission was to hold that line and protect left flank of 30th Inf Div. Contact was made with CC"B", 2d Arm'd Div on left and 30th Inf Div on right.

2d Bn, 116th Inf Regt, 29th Inf Div was attached to CC"A" and closed in reserve defensive position NW of ALSDORF at 0430A.

Ron Co 66th AR reinf, 66th AR (-) reinf and 1st Bn, 66th AR reinf continued to hold the line BEGGENDORF - BAESWEILER - OIDTWEILER - SCHAFENBERG (exclusive).

On the morning of 21 Oct 44 CC "A" was alerted by the CG, 2d Armd Div to be prepared for an enemy armored attack against our line. Belgian Intelligence Sources reported that the enemy was planning a three pronged attack to be launched within the next four days against the line held by the 2d Armd Div utilizing one Panzer Division and supported by infantry available which was thought to be at least three battalions. One prong of the attack was reported scheduled to be launched SW from IMMENDORF, the second E from ALDENHOVEN and the third W or SW from HONGEN. A conference of CC "A" unit commanders was held at CC "A" CP 211300A Oct 44. All units were alerted to be prepared for the expected attack. "Stand-to" for all units was scheduled for 0630A at which time all personnel would be at their posts on the alert. CC "A" Reserve was strengthened by the attachment of Co H, 66th AR to CC "A" which closed in assembly area vicinity K878588 at 212320A Oct 44. During the period that followed the only indication of enemy preparations for the attack on the COA front was an increase in traffic, both of wheeled and track vehicles, through and in enemy held towns opposite our front lines and on their close-in supply routes. All traffic movements and vehicle concentrations observed or heard that were within

range were taken under heavy fire by our artillery. On 25 Oct 44 the expected enemy attack had not developed and there were no indications that such an attack was imminent. Units were released from alert status on that date.

1st Bn, 405th Inf Regt, 102d Inf Div was attached to CC"A" and joined 27 Oct 44. At time of attachment this battalion was assembled in vicinity K791590. Upon attachment, 1st Bn, 405th Inf was assigned the mission of relieving those elements of CC"A" engaged in holding the line in the RAESWEILER - CIDTWEILER Sector. A thorough reconnaissance of positions to be taken over was made by officers of the battalion during daylight 27-28 Oct 44. The relief was begun morning 28 Oct 44 with Co D, 405th Inf moving into the sector by infiltration and taking over those heavy weapons positions not under enemy observation during the daylight and the others after dark. The remainder of the battalion moved into the sector beginning 282000A Oct and completed the relief at 282500A Oct 44.

Co A, 82d Ron Bn relieved Ron Co., 66th AR in the BEGGENDORF Sector effective 282130A Oct 44.

3rd Bn, 116th Inf Regt was detached from CC"A" and reverted to 116th Inf Regt upon being relieved from its sector. 3rd Bn, 116th Inf cleared CC"A" sector 290050A Oct 44.

Throughout the period our artillery harrassed the enemy's front line troops and forward supply routes. Night reconnaissance patrols probed the enemy's front lines. When available fighter-bombers were used to strike at located active enemy artillery, OPs and armored vehicles.

c. Enemy activity during period -

The period covered by this report can roughly be divided into two periods of action. The first from 1st to 16th November resulted in a static defensive action with fire and patrolling the only offensive activities. The enemy apparently utilized this period to improve defensive posts (laying wire, digging trenches and cr ditches, laying mines etc.), and to reform and regroup his mobile forces. Considerable vehicular movement took place on roads behind enemy front line during hours of darkness. The second period 17-30 Nov was purely a defensive and delaying action. During this period the enemy stubbornly resisted our advance with heavy concentrations of artillery, dug in tanks, mortar, and small arms fire. His successive lines of delay were at the A4 obstacles and minefields generally along the lines GRONHEIDEN, PUFFEN-DOE, SHTEINHOF, LINDEN, MUSSENHOVEN, and KLEIN, MUSSENHOVEN. Strongest points appeared to be at LINDEN and MUSSENHAUSEN where tanks (some of which were dug in) and artillery offered fanatical resistance. After the fall of MUSSENHAUSEN and BIRKEN, and the high ground to the south and northwest the enemy made some attempt to withdraw to north, south and east. This withdrawal was covered by tanks and artillery fire.

d. Enemy forces in this sector were in the most part elements of 2 divs, the 8th Pz Div and the 240 or 340 Grn Divs, and one Grn Pz Gr (503). These units were supplemented with various other small units (parts of 240 Pz Regt, 14 Pz Gr, etc) which were scattered in the break-through. Total strength estimated to be 4000-5000 men and approximately 20 tanks and of guns.

enemy was well supplied in all classes. Morale in main from fair to high. Exceptionally high morale in 8th Pz Div and 503 Grn Pz Gr.

e. Miscellaneous: Estimated enemy casualties including PWs -

1. Estimated killed - 800

2. Prisoners - 728

3. Vehicles destroyed - Tanks: 10 PzKpfw I, 6 PzKpfw II, 1 PzKpfw III, 1 PzKpfw IV, 7 PzKpfw V (K), 1 forced to burn, 6 light tanks, 1000 vehicles. In the course of day included withdrawal of several PzKpfw IV, 1000 vehicles, 1000 vehicles.



1. ENEMY:

 - Period 010001A Dec to 031330A Dec: patrol contact only with elements of 240 Volksgrenadier Div.
 - Period 031330A Dec to 212000A Dec: Not in contact.
 - 212000A Dec to 002100A Dec: all elements of 2d Pz Div and 3 Pz Abn and 10 and 11 Pz Gren Regt, 9th Pz Div. (See Annex 1)
 - Known Reserves: See Annex 1.
 - Brief Description of enemy activity:
During the period 010001A Dec to 031330A Dec the sy having been decisively defeated W of the ROK R, withdrew to the E of the R to reform and consolidate. Activity was limited to light arty fire and patrol activity. On 213000A Dec he was continuing his headlong drive toward LUSI R. An abn composed of ren elements and arty was met head on by a tank force of German command "A" in vic of LULUON and was destroyed. This was the limit of the sy's adv to the W. The 2d Pz Div which had been spearheading the breakthrough was cut off W of LICHINAT and destroyed. Elements of the 2nd Pz Div in an attempt to rally the trapped forces were decisively defeated at HUWALIE and HUWAN. The high water mark of the counter-offensive had been reached and now began to recede eastward.
 - Estimate of enemy strength:
At the crest of the sy's counter offensive morale was exceptionally high. All the personnel felt that they were pulling a win fr sure defeat. There the adv was checked and went into reverse, morale followed suit. Sy's offensive divs were well equipped and full strength in personnel and equipment.

During 2d Inf Div was defending the LICHINAT (area) - date - 111 100.3 - Hill 99.5 (See only 1, on 1 Dec 44 with 62 men in reinf on R, 1st bn, 41 mil. reinf in center and 1st bn, 119 inf reinf on L. (See tp list for composition of groups).
 - On 2 Dec 44, 62 men in reinf extended its line to the R, rolling elements of 1st bn, 41 mil in one-half of B.M.L. 1st bn, 41 mil sent out patrols into woods N and NE of B.M.L to intercept sy inf retreating fr LICHINAT. 1st bn, 119 inf reinf engaged in clearing

woods N of BATHURST toward PLASSIERS to establish contact with 107 Inf in PLASSIERS. (See only 2 for dispositions as of 0300 Dec 44).

CC "A", 2d Armd Div relvd CG "A" fr responsibility of holding line effective 0300 Dec 44. Upon relief CG "A" assembled in BATHURST out of contact with ey.

4. 4-16 Dec 44:

Throughout the period 4-16 Dec 44 CC "A" remained in BATHURST engaging in rehabilitation of personnel, maintenance of vehicles and arms, and individual crew and unit tng.

3. 17-20 Dec 44:

Effective 170000 Dec 44 CC "A" was placed on six (6) hr alert for movement. Plans were made for movement with XIII Corps. Plan was made of routes to assy areas in XIII Corps zone.

Security patrols operated throughout CC "A" area during hrs of darkness as protection against possible ey paratroop atk.

4. 21-22 Dec 44:

at 212200 Dec 44 CC "A" moved fr BATHURST, Germany to an assy area via LIEGE AVES, MULHOUSE prepared to move to counter any ey movement fr S or SE. CC "A" closed in this assy area 213000 Dec 44. (See tp list for composition of forces). (See only 4 for disps as of 212200)

5. 23 Dec 44:

CC "A" recd orders at 1130.. to proceed as quickly as possible to CLAY to block ey rptd approaching CLAY fr E & SE.

TF "A" moved out with medium tk co leading via route shown on only followed by TF "B" and TF "C" in that order over routes shown.

TF "A" reached CLAY without incident and contacted elements of British armor in the town. Rd block were established on the outskirts of CLAY on the BATHURST-CLAY rd and on the high ground S of CLAY (120900). 2d Bn, 60 Inf (-E Co) continued S fr CLAY on hwy to LIEGE and encountered the ey in LIEGE.

TF "B" was moved through CLAY to assy area S of town and blocked to SW, S and SE, contacting British elements and relvng elements of TF "A".

TF "C" assembled NE edge of CLAY blocking to NE and SE and relvng elements of TF "A" on high ground at 120900 and extended rd block to S and SE as far as W at 130000 (160904).

18 Dec, 60 Inf Bn assembled on N edge of CLAY and put rd blocks on rd S to N and E. It also patrolled the rd CLAY - LIEGE as far as LIEGE and found it to be in British possession. It also patrolled the rd CLAY - LIEGE and found friendly vehicles only on this rd.

TF "A" attkd LIEGE in two obs, one composed of 2d Bn, 60 Inf (-E Co) attkd along the route CLAY-LIEGE; the other composed of the balance of TF "A" moved via LIEGE (160904) to LIEGE.

6. 24 Dec 44:

Orders were read to 1) hold CLAY at all costs, 2) continue adv S fr LIEGE and 3) patrol S as far as BATHURST (0171).

TF "A" was assembled in LIEGE and proceeded without incident through CLAY to a pt 167072 where an ey obs moving N along the hwy was encountered. This obs was almost completely destroyed by TF "A".

TF"B" moved into Laffeld replacing TF"A".

B Co, 62 Inf Bn took over rd blocks 3 and SE of Cilly replacing TF"A" and sent one platoon to Sullyville (1156h) with orders to proceed at daylight on road to Mirecourt.

At daylight TF"B" moved out in two columns, one through Yuller, another through Cilly and Sullyville.

Platoon B Co, 62 Inf Bn moved out at daylight on Sullyville but encountered the ey 3 of Cilly (0936h) and was unable to adv further to the S.

Another platoon, B Co, 62 Inf Bn moved on rd Cilly-Sullyville to AJ (0740h) then S but encountered the ey in BCs de Genuval (0707) and was forced to retire to Cilly-Sullyville by.

TF"A" made slow progress but TF"B" proceeded with both columns along its routes. A considerable number of the ey was caught between TF"A" and TF"B". TF"B" was particularly successful in destroying ey vehicles on the rd SE fr Sullyville.

TF"B" secured and cleared Sullyville and placed rd blocks SE of the town.

TF"A" secured and cleared AJ (1720h) contacting elements of 4 Cav Cp at AJ (1600h).

C Co, 62 Inf Bn (-1 platoons) was struck to CC"A" for the purpose of helping to hold Cilly and for patrolling to Mirecourt. C Co, 62 Inf Bn (-1 platoons) established rd blocks N and W of Cilly and patrolled to Mirecourt. 1 Platoon Co C, 66 Inf patrolled the town of Cilly contacting the British on the SE. C Co, 17 Engr Bn (-2 platoons) prepared rd blocks of mines to be placed on rds S and SW of Cilly and manned these posts.

TF"C" moved into Laffeld after TF"B" moved out and took over mission of blocking to S and SW. It placed an outpost of 1 Platoon, 1 Co, 66 Inf via J.M. (1600).

CC"B" relieved CC"A" in the mission of holding Cilly about dark.

TF"A" remained in Sullyville, TF"B" remained in Sullyville; TF"C" moved to vic of Laffeld blocking to N, SW and SE; HQ CC"A" Co A, 17 Engr Bn (-2 platoons), HQ Co, 702 Inf Bn (-3 platoons) and HQ Co, 62 Inf Bn (-1 platoon) moved to L.Ville (2007). Main Co, 66 Inf moved into Cilly.

Co B, 62 Inf Bn reverted to control of CC"B" upon relief of CC"A".

7. 25 Dec 44
TF"A" attacked S at 1600h for Mirecourt and Sullyville to clear woods to S in zone and to seize Mirecourt. ey fire and inf in woods to S resisted stubbornly. At dark TF"A" withdrew fr woods to a more favorable posn for the night. (see ovly pg).

TF"B" repulsed an ey attk fr S launched at 0000h with arty and tk gun fire. Co A, 62 Inf with one platoon atched attkd at 1510h fr high ground SE of Sullyville to seize Mirecourt. This mission was accomplished and the town of Mirecourt secured at 1600h.

TF"C" in res blocked rd's to SE and S. One platoon Co, 66 Inf seized town of Villerupt and established rd blocks to S and SE thoro.

(see ovly pg for dispositions as of 252200h Dec 44).

6. 26 Dec 44:
 TF^{"A"} atkd afternoon 26 Dec 44 seized area occupied high ground vic 190000, Ruckebach and Aulbach.
 TF^{"B"}-at 0720A an eng force consisting of 10 tk & tks and inf atkd the town of H.W. which was held by Co I, 66 AR regt. The atk was repulsed by arty and tk gun fire with a loss of 5 tks for the eng.
 TF^{"C"} continued in CC^{"A"} areas and maintained rd blocks to S, SW and E. Elements of TF^{"C"} took over town of Aulbach when it was vacated by TF^{"A"}.  4 Cav Up Regt cleared eng fr now & N zone to Ruckebach N and relvd all other elements of CC^{"A"} in zone. Relief was completed at 1500A.

11. 27-31 Dec 44:

CC "A" was relvd fr holding line of L'Kane & it in some by elements of 100 Brigade (ar) on 30 Dec 44. Relief was completed and responsibility passed at 1050... all elements of CC "A" closed in assy area vic of L'Kane at 2030h.

31 Dec 44 was spent in maintenance of vehicles and tps and resting of personnel.

e. Efficiency:
Efficiency of the org during the period was excellent. Morale was high at all times. Losses due to ey action were small. Losses not due to ey action were of a minor nature (ie chiefly to colds and exposure). Vehicles and equipment losses were small and were replaced almost immediately.

f. Results of operations:
The operation during the latter part of the period stopped the ey's adv to the " after his breakthrough which started 17 Dec 44. An attk by supporting ey tps was decisively beaten and the ey was forced to begin his withdrawal to the E.

c. Brief description of ey activity:

ey was caught off balance by our atk the morning of 3 Jan 45. This fact substantiated by r.s of 3 ss reg, 2 ss Pz Div, who stated that their unit had planned small atk with limited obj's that same day. Initial success gained by our surprise atk could not be readily exploited since the nature of the terrain and the prevailing winter conditions afforded by excellent defensive opportunities. When the original purpose of our atk became evident ey withdrew his ss div, leaving the less valued 500 Volks Gren Div and elements of 116 Pz Div, and orders to cover their withdrawal and to delay our adv while the remnants of units in the western section of the German salient withdrew to the E to prevent being encircled by our developing pincer movement. This delay was effected by the employment of road blocks (felled trees and minefields) at critical points, infantry equipped with small arms and bazookas, T guns, Nebelwerfers, artillery, and some tank and/or guns.

When the 2d Arm'd Div, 1st US Army driving from the 11 Arm'd Div, 3rd US Ar'y made contact at Hohne (Pfaff) and the gap was closed, although the bulk of the German forces had effected their withdrawal to a half of the ground gained by the Germans and been regained by the allies, the only hopes two German may have entertained of renewing his offensive in this sector, were for the time being at least, definitely thwarted.

d. estimate of ey strength and morale:

2 SS Pz Div

Although this div had been up to full strength at the beginning of the German offensive, at the time of its initial contact with 2d Arm'd

div (3 Jan 45), its co strength was estimated to range between 20 and 65. For the most part, the officers and NCOs were the fanatical type soldiers which one would expect to find in an SS Div, but a high percentage of the men were Hungarians and Romanians, and men fr the Navy and Air Force, all of whom claimed to have been drafted into the SS. Morale poor.

SS Volks Gren Div

The Div suffered heavy losses prior to and during their engagement with the 2 Inf Div. By 11 Jan 45 the remnants of the Div had been org into a Kampfgruppe with an estimated strength of 350 men. All men fr the unit were aware that they had been left behind to be sacrificed while the tanks were brought to the rear for reorganization. Morale poor.

On 1 Jan 45, CC "A" assembled in vic of ~~WILHELM~~, BAGIUM, out of contact with the ey. (See ovly #1, annex no. 3 for dispositions). At 021200A Jan 45 CC "A" moved fr vic ~~WILHELM~~ to assy area vic SW of ~~WILHELM~~, closed at 030200A Jan 45 prepared to atk S through line held by 75 Inf Div at 030030A Jan 45.

2. 3 Jan 45

TF "A" crossed LD (line held by elements of 75 Inf Div) at 030030A Jan 45 in two clns. Town and ~~WILHELM~~ were seized without serious opposition and by dark TF "A" occupied high ground W and NW of ~~WILHELM~~. By tanks in ~~WILHELM~~ prevented TF "A" fr occupying that town on 3 Jan 45. TF "B" crossed LD (line held by elements of 75 Inf Div) at 030030A Jan 45 seized and secured the high ground and woods 1200 yds NW of ~~WILHELM~~ by 1015A. PERIOD 1-28 FEBRUARY 45

1. ACTIVITY:

a. Units in contact:

The only period during the month of February in which this Combat Group was in contact with the enemy was 28 Feb. At this time a bridgehead had been secured across the Adige River threatening the German forces west of the village. At the time of commitment of the Combat Group, the group was moving from all armed units in this area: Volkstrum, fortress brigades, AA Divs., mobile obs., etc., in an attempt to bolster his faltering defenses. The principal, and most org'd units in contact at this time were:

b. enemy reserves:

Enemy reserves were generally local. These included divs which were under-strength and had been assembled in rear areas for regrouping. It is believed that the only reserves capable of offering any serious resistance to the accomplishment of our mission were:

c. Brief description of enemy activity:

At the time of commitment of this div, enemy activity consisted of fighting a withdrawing and delaying action. Villages and dug-in strong pts were manned by inf and covered by AF guns and tanks. No offensive action was taken during this period. Enemy arty was generally moderate. Some harassing fire was placed in rear areas by heavy cal guns.

d. estimate of enemy strength and morale:

It is impracticable to estimate the strength of enemy forces in this sector. The German forces lacked strength in armor needed for aggressive action. They were committed singly or in small groups in a defensive role. The enemy's morale and will to fight faded rapidly. Army line troops though disorganized, fought well as usual. However Volkstrum and less experienced troops usually surrendered when our tanks appeared or after a few well directed rounds of arty fire.





PERIOD 1-31 MAR 45

1. ENEMY:

This rpt covers the pds 1-5 Mar 45 and 30-31 Mar 45. During the pd 6-29 Mar this cmd was not in contact with the ey.

a. Units in contact and description of action:

1 Mar 45. The second day of CCNA's commitment the unity of ey div'l forces appeared to be shattered. No full divs were encountered, rather the Germans following their regular policy, threw all available miscellaneous personnel plus a few battle gms into the line while attempting to withdraw and reorg their shattered fighting gms. Small gms fr all units of 130 Pz Lehr Div were encountered along with 31 Mechan Bn 23V. Heaviest prisoner toll came fr 338 Arty Rgt which was overrun.

2 Mar 45. During the night 1-2 Mar the ey launched 3 local counteratk on our posns at SCHWABACH (1694) using mainly gms fr 130 Pz Lehr Div in an apparent effort to escape the trap at MUNCHEN-GLADBACH. Approx 5 tk, 7 tanks and 200 Inf participated. This atk was stopped, all inf and 1 tk were accounted for. During the day the ey fought a delaying action while org posns to protect KAHLENBERG and UERNINGEN. 130 Pz Lehr Div was again in contact with 131 Arty Rgt, which was overrun, furnishing the largest number of prisoners. Volksturm fr city of KREISLICH were encountered but surrendered with practically no resistance. Considerable resistance was offered by 686 AA Bn (82mm guns) and by 23 Para Arty Rgt. Both of these units were overrun and destroyed.

3-4 Mar 45. The ey strongly defended in the vic of KAHLEN-GLADBACH (2411) with tks, inf, and dual purpose anti-aircraft guns. Large numbers of Volksturm were encountered but offered no serious resistance. Large numbers of anti-aircraft guns (88mm) fr 31 AA Rgt (Ktz), 315 AA Bn (GRG) 820 AA Bn, and 401 Hvy AA Bn were destroyed. Tks encountered were fr 15 Pz Gren Div and inf was identified as 23 Para Rgt.

29-30 Mar 45. This cmd crossed RHINE R and was committed in a breakthrough made by XVIII AB Corps. There was practically no contact in the first two days of this opn. Approx 150 prisoners representing many various and scattered units were taken. There was no orgd resistance. Civilian population made no unfriendly acts. No civilians were encountered fr the Volksturm.

1. ENEMY:

a. Units in contact:

No divn'l units opposed us throughout the entire opn. As our adv plunged through the heart of Germany's tng & replacement system, one ersatz unit after another, as well as assorted AA Bns, Policemen, and airport tps, was tossed into the line to provide local defenses. Of the misc tps opposing us the closest to org'd resistance was provided by members of:

OCS Course 6, DETMOLD
Kampfgruppe SCHOENWALD
SS Pz Tng & Repl. Bn
48 Fortress Regt.

b. Ey res during this pd were practically non-existent.

c. Brief description of enemy activity:

Except for certain natural defense lines provided by the DORTMUND-EMS Canal, the ridge of the TEUTOBURGER WALD, the WESER R, and finally the ELBE, plus occasional futile efforts to turn towns into bastions, ey activity showed virtually no evidence of orgn.

At the DORTMUND-EMS Canal resistance consisted of blown bridges, inf with Panzerfausts, and random tks. Tps here consisted chiefly of hard fighting, young officer candidates fr the DNTMOLD school.

The pass through the TEUTOBURGER WALD at AUGUSTDORF was defended stubbornly by SS Tng units fr SENNELAGER, and at OERLINGSHAUSEN by Kampfgruppe SCHOENWALD consisting of misc repl and tng personnel held together by the leadership of Captain SCHOENWALD. Here the ey took full advantage of the terrain in deploying inf armed with automatic wpns and panzerfausts. Some few SP guns were also employed in this area. They were also able to mount several limited-obj counter atks, supported by some armor previously used for tng purposes by the SS Pz REIM & Tng Bn. In neither counter-atk did the strength exceed two cos.

At the WESER R more blown bridges and inf with Panzerfausts were encountered, but the speed of our adv had been too rapid for any real resistance to be org'd.

The next resistance of any importance was encountered in the area of the HERMAN GOERING WORKS, in and around IMMENDORF. These important factories had been hvly protected by AA guns incl 88mms, and 105mms mounted on rlwy cars. Many were in concrete emplacements. These guns were all depressed for AT and arty purposes. Here the ey held out for one day and after several of their guns had been KO'd by counter-btry fire and air atks, most of the personnel fled or surrendered. Those who fled destroyed their equip before leaving.

The firal phase of the opn was the short siege and assault of MAGDEBURG. Most of the garrison had no desire to put up a fight, but Gen. REGENER, former Cmdt at KUSTRIN and wearer of the Knight's Cross, kept his subordinates in line so that all negotiations for the surrender of the city failed. Gen. REGENER went so far as to attempt a raid on the rear of our bridgehead at SCHOENBECK using tks, scout cars and inf.

When our assault on MAGDEBURG was launched the defense of the city consisted of perimeter rd blocks manned by repl and tng tps, labor service personnel, and Volksturm, orgd into or operating under the 48 Fortress Regt. In our sector there were perhaps 1500 men armed with panzerfausts, automatic wpns and machine guns, plus approx 16 88mm guns, a btry of 3-150mm Italian Hows, about 21-105mm Hows, and about 12 hvy AA rlwy guns. Gen REGENER'S orders were to defend to the last man, but after the perimeter rd blocks had been cleared resistance practically ceased, and the remainder of the defenders surrendered almost by cos. Gen. REGENER fled to KOENIGSBORN to direct defenses on the E side of the ELBE.

Upon withdrawing to the W, CC"A" encountered a threat on the N flank fr a task force of Div Von Clausewitz, a hastily orgd formation that had the mission of disrupting our communications in rear areas, and finally breaking through to the HARZ mountains.. No CC"A" units ever made cmbt contact with this task force which was defeated and dispersed before reaching our sector.

1. Estimate of Enemy Strength and Morale:

With the exception of the DETMOLD Officer Candidates and General Regener, the fighting spirit of tps encountered during the month was virtually non-existent. Most of them were rear-echelon tps not interded for cmbt, and the officers taken did not bring up the average of the morale since they as well were largely finance, induction-center, QM and other desk-job soldiers.

TF"A" with sub-force "Warren", was hvly engaged in the LAMERSHAGEN pass in the TEUTOBERGER WALD in the HARZ mountains until relvd by CC"R", 2d AD on 2 Apr 45. On the night of 2-3 Apr 45, TF"A" atkd through CC"R" swung behind the force opposing TF"R" at OERLINGHAUSEN and atkd E in zone securing LAGE on night 3 Apr 45. Atk was continued without pause and by night of 4 Apr 45, TF"A" was one (1) mi fr the HAMELN bridge over the WESER R having advd over forty mi against resistance and defended rd blocks. After having cleared the W bank of the river in zone, TF"A" crossed the WESER and by night of 5 Apr 45 was in HASTENBECK fr whence the atk was continued without rest. On 7 Apr 45, TF"A" reached the line of the LEINE and INNERSTE Rs at SARSTEDT. Crossings were secured, sector cleared and on 9 Apr 45, TF"A" atkd E and then N in zone on R of 5 AD. The atk being cancelled by receipt of new zone and new mission TF"A" disengaged, moved into assy area vic SARSTEDT, and sent an adv element into new sector SE of HILDESHEIM to clear its assy area W of the LD. TF"A" atkd 10 Apr 45 in zone and on 11 Apr 45 had seized and secured city of WOLFENBUTTEL. The numerous important installations to be guarded and the problems arising fr a large civilian population and thousands of Allied PWs and Displaced Persons, freed political prisoners and criminals occupied TF"A" until relvd by elements of TF"R" on 12 Apr 45. TF"A" then cont'd the atk in zone advng to line of ELBE R N of MAGDEBURG. On 14 Apr 45, TF"A" became CC"A" Res and remained in that status through 18 Apr 45.
TF"B" cont'd atk E in zone fr OELDE on 1 Apr 45 without pause and was hvly engaged in the AUGUSTDORF pass through the TEUTOBERGER WALD in the HARZ mountains that night. TF"B" cont'd its atk and secured the pass on 3 Apr 45. On 4 Apr 45, TF"B" participated in a converging atk against the built up area E of the pass and N of DETMOLD with TF"R", reformed and atkd E in zone advng over thirty mi by dark to GR BERKEL on the W bank of WESER R where rd blocks and blown bridges caused a slight delay. Overcoming these obstacles and continuing the atk TF"B" made the initial bridge-head over the WESER, releasing its inf to TF"R" upon

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arrival of the latter for the expansion of the bridgehead. When the bridgehead was completed the tks of TF "R" were crossed and then TF "B", with its inf returned, was investing the city of HAMELN E of the WESER R fr the S by dark on 5 Apr 45. Upon relief by TF "R", TF "B" cont'd the atk E in zone without rest and seized and secured a bridge over the LEINE R N of HILDESHEIM in the vic of SCHULENBERG by dark. The atk was cont'd and a crossing secured over the INNERSTE R. On night of 9 Apr 45 a new mission and a new sector cancelled these opns and TF "B" moved SE of HILDESHEIM to atk E in the new zone, reaching the S edge of SALDER where it was hvly engaged by dark on 10 Apr 45. Continuous atkng brought TF "B" to the W bank of the ELBE R just N of MAGDEBURG on 12 Apr 45 where posns were consolidated in preparation for the final assault on the city. Forces were regrouped on 16 and 17 Apr 45.

TF "R" moved fr vic OELDE on 1 Apr 45 and by dark was hvly engaged in the OERLINGHAUSEN Pass in the TEUTOBERGER WALD in the HARZ mountains. On 3 Apr 45 the pass was secured and on 4 Apr 45, TF "R" made contact with CC "R" E of the pass, participated in a converging atk on the built up area N of DETMOLD with TF "B", regrouped and cont'd the adv E in zone, moving to ARZEN near the WESER R by dark. By dark on 5 Apr 45 an initial bridgehead over the WESER had been secured by TF "B". TF "R" took cmd of all inf of both TF "R" and TF "B" and expanded and completed the bridgehead. After TF "R" 's tks were crossed, the TF "B" inf was released and the armor of TF "B" crossed and TF "R" was assembled in TUNDERN. TF "R" relvd TF "B" S of HAMELN and when relvd in turn, cont'd the adv E in zone, reaching SCHULENBERG on the LEINE R on 7 Apr 45. On the night 8-9 Apr 45, elements of TF "R" crossed the INNERSTE R and secured the town of HARSUM. A new mission and new zone cancelled these opns and on 10 Apr 45, TF "R" moved SE of HILDESHEIM and atkd E in zone reaching vic of BARBECKE by dark. On 11 Apr 45 IMMENDORF and the HERMANN-GOERING WERKE were occupied by TF "R" which relvd TF "A" in WOLFENBUTTEL on 12 Apr 45. By 14 Apr 45, TF "R" was relvd in these areas and moved E in zone consolidating posns just W of MAGDEBURG in preparation for the final assault on the city. Forces were regrouped on 16 and 17 Apr 45.

1st Bn, 119 Inf (Reinf) atkd MAGDEBURG in zone on 17 Apr 45 advng against stubborn resistance and strongly defended rd blocks. On 18 Apr 45 the limit of adv was reached and secured and 1st Bn, 119 Inf Reinf consolidated its posns.


