1. This report supplements report no. 578, "Defense Against Mortars", forwarded 21 October 1944.
 2. The 2d Infantry Division in line of 1 V.I., A.D. 110th reports successful use of the Mortar Alert system adopted as used by the 4th Infantry Division.
 3. Attention invited to forms used in reporting and recording the date.
 4. This system is highly regarded by the 2d and 4th Infantry Divisions. Both divisions were in a similar type of situation, i.e. static holding line fronts, no confronted with an enemy who was making active use of his mortars.
 5. Major Daniel Foster, Capt C-2, 2d Infantry Division, reported:
"I have noted the system used by the 4th Infantry Division. In this phase of our operation it has proven highly successful. Mortars have been extensively used by the Germans on our front. This type of fire is particularly hard on our troops. No shell gives warning. Among the advantages offered by this system are: first the soldiers are intensely interested in it. They feel that they are 'doing something' about it". He reported ~~that~~ rapidly develops a still in location by sound of the 'ping' and examination of the crater. Second, the division commander, by watching these reports for picking out mortar locations, has something more definite to go on than observation of the terrain only and in laying their fires for an advance. He has found that the enemy is very prone to use the same location over and over. He will have the mortar in a certain pillar, set it up, fire a few rounds, dismount it, and return it to the pillar. He feels that we are building up quite an accurate knowledge of his mortar locations in procedure on our front."

... 1st Inf. 2nd Inf. Regt. report: It is held at the system.
and believe it to be the most reasonable method to do so. There
are no major roads in it. The enemy frequently crosses streams, that is the
fire on one stream or position will cover from in front of another ad-
vance or position. This system can be used by putting the guns, battalions
as on my map, in an attempt to do sufficient to hold up the enemy divisions.

To plot the various positions on an overlay on our maps. A radio message
overlay that gives the various key signs in names of all our roads and
crossing points. Also the account of the battle or fight in detail
of those places. Then when you come to a position, I can report your
fire & unit to the end of it. I expect my northern side to be in
our action at 1300 hrs. But I do not think we will be very long unless
it is to have been driven into the enemy's north wing.


