

2. Under the provisions of Par. 15, AR 210-10, 1st Lt. JESSE D. WADSWORTH, JR., (O-341300), C.A.C., is placed on detached service without expense to the government for a period of one (1) day, effective December 16, 1941, for the purpose of proceeding to Camp Wheeler, Ga., in connection with Military Police Activities, and returning to Fort Benning, Georgia.

3. Under the provisions of Par. 2b., Army Regulations 615-290, and Section II, Circular, #129, War Department, 1941, Private RONALD A. ADAMS, 14045924, Company B, 38th Infantry Training Battalion, Camp Croft, South Carolina, having reported at this station from AWOL, and his Organization Commander having indicated that he can be trusted with transportation, (now casually attached to Induction Station, this station), and being without sufficient funds to return to his proper station, will proceed from Fort Benning, Georgia, to Camp Croft, S.C., reporting upon arrival thereat to his organization commander for duty.

The Quartermaster Corps will furnish the necessary transportation.

It being impracticable for the government to furnish cooking facilities for rations, the Finance Department will pay in advance the monetary travel allowance prescribed in Table II, Par. 2a., AR 35-4520, as amended, at the rate of \$2.25 per day for one (1) man for two-thirds (2/3) of one (1) day, for rations enroute to Camp Croft, South Carolina.

The entire cost of transportation and the increased cost of subsistence will be charged against Pvt. ADAMS in compliance with Par. 3a., AR 615-290.

The travel directed is necessary in the military service and payment when made is chargeable to procurement authority FD 1411 P 7-06 A 0410-2 and QM 6 P 3-03 A.0505-2.

BLUE RIDGE ROAD Extends from (30.1-12.2) on Lightning Road to (32.0-08.0) on Liberty Road.

LUMPKIN TRAIL South of Owichée Creek, Lumpkin Road changed to Lumpkin Trail.

✓ LUMPKIN ROAD Extended north from (16.2-22.2) on Fort Benning Boulevard to northern end of reservation (16.1-25.7).

MIDWEST ROAD Extended north to its intersection with Red Arrow Road.

SUNSET ROAD From (29.8-37.0) to its intersection with Midwest Road at (31.2-55.0).

1. Extension School Memorandum No. 2, this headquarters, October 11, 1937, is revoked.

2. The Branch Extension School established at this station pursuant to paragraph 6 c, Extension School Memorandum No. 1, Headquarters Fourth Corps, August 10, 1939, will be known as the BRANCH EXTENSION SCHOOL, FORT BENNING, GEORGIA.

3. The student personnel of this school will consist of such officers of the following categories as enroll in the extension courses:

a. Regular Army Officers assigned or attached to units stationed at Fort Benning.

b. Reserve officers assigned or attached to Active Regular Army units stationed at Fort Benning except those exempt by Corps Area Headquarters or higher authority. Regular Army active units (RA) are those regiments, detached elements thereof, and similar units with an active headquarters. Active units will include inactive elements thereof.

4. ENROLLMENT: The method of enrollment will be as prescribed in Army Regulations No. 350-3000.

5. APPLICATIONS: a. Reserve Officers. Applications of Reserve Officers will be handled as directed by Extension School Memorandum No. 1, Fourth Corps Area, August 10, 1939.

b. Regular Army Officers. Applications for enrollment in the Army Extension Courses from Regular Army officers on duty, or attached for duty, at this station will be forwarded to this headquarters through regular channels. The forwarding endorsement will indicate whether approved or disapproved. If approved, an instructor will be designated. In case of disapproval, the reason will be stated. This headquarters will take final action on the application. When an application for enrollment has been approved in this office, it will be forwarded through the organization commander to the designated instructor. The proper subcourse, necessary texts and copies of W.D. AGO Forms No. 147 and 153 will be attached. The instructor will forward promptly to the applicant the approved application for enrollment, and the subcourse material and texts as prescribed in paragraph 22, Extension School Memorandum No. 1, Hq. Fourth Corps Area, August 10, 1939.

6. MARKING SOLUTIONS: Upon receipt of a student's solution at this headquarters it will be forwarded informally to the organization commander concerned. Solutions will be marked under the direction of organization commanders. The



marking of solutions of Officers on duty with the Academic Department will be conducted under the direction of the Assistant Commandant. The provisions of paragraphs 19, 20, and 21, A.R. 350-3000 and paragraph 11 a and b, Extension School Memorandum No. 1, Headquarters Fourth Corps Area, August 10, 1939, will govern. Before a paper is marked "unsatisfactory" it will be marked separately by not less than two officers. Before a student's second unsatisfactory solution to the same lesson or examination is returned to the Branch Extension School, the Organization commander will cause the marking of the paper to be reviewed. When the marking of a solution is delayed beyond a reasonable time for any cause the instructor will acknowledge receipt of the solution and explain the delay by letter direct to the student. Normally, solutions will be marked by instructors and returned to the Officer in Charge, Army Extension Courses, Branch Extension School, within five (5) days, excluding Sundays and Holidays.

7. CERTIFICATES OF COMPLETION OF SUBCOURSES: When a student completes a subcourse, the instructor will prepare a Certificate of Completion of Subcourse (W.D. A.G.O. Form No. 152) as prescribed in paragraph 17, Extension School Memorandum No. 1, Headquarters Fourth Corps Area. After signing it, the instructor will forward it to this office for approval. The numerical rating attained will be entered on all copies of the Certificate of Completion of Subcourse. This rating is determined as prescribed by sub-paragraph 24c, A.R. 350-3000.

8. TEXT BOOK AND LESSON MATERIAL: The initial supply of text books and lesson material will be furnished a newly enrolled student as prescribed in paragraph 6 of this memorandum. Lesson material required later in the subcourse will be furnished as prescribed by par. 18c A.R. 350-3000. Upon receipt of a student's solution to the examination of a subcourse, new material will be furnished as prescribed by 24 g, A.R. 350-3000. Material and Texts required by Organizations will be obtained from the Officer in Charge Army Extension Courses, Branch Extension School.

9. When a student is transferred, his lesson assignment card (W.D., A.G.O. Form No. 147) will be sent to this headquarters for transfer, with his other extension school records, to his new organization.

10. CANCELLATION OF ENROLLMENT: Enrollments will be cancelled under the conditions cited in paragraph 15, A.R. 350-3000. Instructors will examine all lesson assignment cards (W.D. A.G.O. Form No. 147), not less than once each month to determine whether minimum requirements are being met. When it has been determined that an officer is not meeting the minimum requirements a letter will be sent that officer informing him that the minimum requirements must be met or his enrollment will be cancelled. If no excuse is given that warrants continuing his enrollment and no lesson material is submitted his name will be furnished this headquarters with request for the enrollment being cancelled. The minimum requirements are prescribed in paragraph 15, A.R. 350-3000.

11. In addition to the instructions contained in this memorandum, the conduct of the extension courses will be governed by A.R. 350-3000, the annual letter


