PATCH, U.S. Army, distinguished Infantry Officer, former Commander of the 7th Army, who died at San Antonio, Texas, 2 November 1945.

SECTION III - BRANN RANGE

The self-propelled weapons range now unofficially known as Nottingham Range, Map, "Fort Benning Reservation, 1944" scale 1/62,500 (Coordinates 1427.5 - 1013.7); is hereby designated as "BRANN RANGE" in honor of MAJOR GENERAL DONALD W. BRANN, U.S. Army, distinguished Infantry Officer, formerly Chief of Staff, American Forces in Austria, who died in the Austrian Tyrol in Europe, 29 December 1945.

SECTION IV - WARNER RANGE

The self-propelled weapons range now unofficially known as the Weems Pond Range, Map, "Fort Benning Reservation, 1944", scale 1/62,500 (Coordinates 1427.6 - 1014.8); is hereby designated as "WARNER RANGE" in honor of CORPORAL HENRY F. WARNER, AT Company, 26th Infantry Regiment, who was posthumously awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor for heroic action during a heavy enemy tank attack in Belgium, 20-21 December 1944.

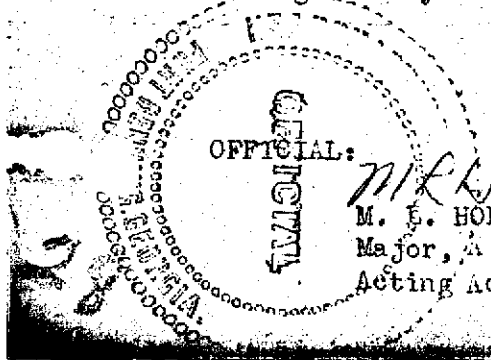

THE INFANTRY SCHOOL LIBRARY

1. THE INFANTRY SCHOOL LIBRARY is designated a permanent library, within the meaning of AR 35-6800, dated 12 March 1946, under the direction and supervision of the Assistant Commandant.

2. PURPOSE AND SCOPE.

a. The primary mission of the Infantry School Library is to furnish a military history reference collection for the use of students and faculty of The Infantry School, and, secondly, to stimulate thought and broaden outlook by constantly procuring the latest books and documents concerning the military and allied subjects.

b. To accomplish this the Library will:

- (1) Acquire books and documents as outlined in paragraph 3 below.
- (2) Catalog books, documents, and maps, index military periodicals, maintain accession lists, shelf lists, and stock record accounts.
- (3) Furnish research assistance and loan service to military personnel who are students or members of The Infantry School, the Airborne School, or AGF Board No. 3. Other military personnel of the Post of Fort Benning may use the facilities of the Library by special arrangement.
- (4) Enforce provisions of AR 380-5 regarding classified material.

3. ORGANIZATION.

a. Authorized Operating Personnel.

- (1) Librarian - the commissioned officer in charge of the Library is designated the Librarian. He will be immediately responsible for the efficiency of operation and administration of the Library.
- (2) Two Civil Service Librarians rated P-2 and P-3 respectively.
- (3) One Civil Service Clerk-Typist rated CAF-4.

- (4) One enlisted mail orderly and librarian's helper with Tec 4 rating.
- (5) One enlisted stock room attendant with Tec 5 rating.

b. Accountability.

- (1) The Librarian is designated the accountable property officer and will assume accountability for the library collection and responsibility for other library property.
- (2) The Library will be operated and records maintained as provided for in AR 35-6800, dated 12 March 1946, paragraphs 5 - 11 inclusive.

c. Library Committee.

- (1) A Library Committee consisting of the following is hereby appointed:

Chairman -- Chief, General Subjects Section
Member -- Representative of the Tactical Section
Member -- Representative of the Weapons Section
Recorder -- Librarian

- (2) This committee, subject to approval of the Assistant Commandant, is charged with the general supervision of the Library and its affairs, the preparation of regulations for the administration and interior economy of the Library, and with the selection of books, periodicals, and other publications and supplies to be obtained therefor.
- (3) In the acquisition of a suitable library collection, the Committee will be guided by the following list compiled in order of priority.
 - (a) A comprehensive collection of military history books and documents for research and reference use.
 - (b) A collection of books and documents on material listed in programs of instruction.
 - (c) A collection of books and documents dealing purely with the Infantry.
 - (d) Books and documents on special professional and cultural subjects including the following:

Biographies	Navigation
Chemistry	Nuclear Energy
Electricity	Pedagogy
Electronics	Photography
Geopolitics	Physical Geography
Languages	Public Speaking
Maps (all nations and countries)	Psychology
Medicine	Radar
Meteorology	Radio

- (e) Files of periodicals and magazines to insure widespread and timely current coverage.
- (f) Up-to-date books and documents as published, not purely military but concerning, or of interest to, the military.
- (g) Microfilm readers and files.

- (4) Recommendations by individuals or activities for acquisitions to the Library will be submitted in writing to the Librarian for action by the Library Committee.

4. FUNDS.

a. Funds necessary for the operation and maintenance of the Library will be made available from the following sources:

- (1) Sub-allotment from War Department appropriations set up for the operation of The Infantry School.
- (2) The Book Department Fund as approved by the Commandant.

b. The Library Committee will anticipate Fiscal requirements for the Library.

c. Experience has shown that the following minimum annual fiscal requirements are required for the operation of the Library and should be used as a basis for planning.

- (1) \$2000 for purchase of books and documents.
- (2) \$500 for binding and repair.
- (3) \$300 for library supplies.

5. RESTRICTIVE RULES.

a. Books and documents will be loaned to military personnel only as restricted by Paragraph 2b (3) above.

b. Books or documents will not be loaned or shipped outside of the Fort Benning area.

c. Books and documents in great demand will be placed on a 7-day shelf and will be loaned not to exceed 7 days.

d. All books other than 7-day books will be loaned not to exceed 14 days, but may be renewed by the borrower in person.

e. Books will not be loaned on Memorandum Receipt.
