Brief History of Unit prior to arrival at Fort Benning, to include dates stations and activities; inactivations, activations etc.:

Like many other enterprises of magnitude and importance the infantry School Detachment is the development from a very small beginning. Its inception took place on 1 April 1907, 43 years ago at the residio of conterey, California. It was then known as a School of musketry, which was organized as a local Training School. Five men, four of them infantrymen and one an Ordnance Sergeant, were comprised in the personnel.

In January 1913 the School of Musketry was transferred to Fort Sill, Cklahoma, where it became a permanent organization and was officially designated as the Detachment, School of Musketry, At that time the authorized strength of detachment was ninety-four enlisted men, eighty-two of whom were transferred to it from other organizations. Colonel Richard M. Blatchford, who later became a Brigadier General, was then Commandant of the School of Musketry to which the detachment belonged.

Cn October 3, 1917, the detachment's official title was changed to the Detachment, Infantry School of Arms, and its enlisted personnel was increased to 428.

In October 1918, the Infantry School of arms was moved to Columbus, Ceorgia, where the detachment was reorganized and enlarged. The detachment a rived in Columbus on October 6th and established its camp on the Macon road just beyond Wynnton. In June 1919, the camp in Columbus was abandoned and the detachment moved to Fort Benning. It was early in 1919 that the machine-gun school was transferred from Camp Hancock, Georgia, to Fort Benning. A portion of the personnel from the Machine-Gun School, comprising some two hundred men, was then transferred to the Detachment, Infantry School of Arms.

On February 10, 1921, the Detachment, Infantry School of Arms was designated

Infantry School Detachment. At that time it consisted of two parts, one white and the other colored. Later the colored section was disbanded and its personnel transferred to other organizations.

The Infantry School Detachment in 1930 consisted of 424 enlisted men, including 20 Master Sergeants, I irst Sergeant, 3 Technical Sergeants, 8 taff Sergeants, 83 Sergeants, 77 Corporals and 232 privates and Privates First-lass, among whom 108 were rated specialists.

It was commended at that time by Major Louis A. Falligant, Infantry who was assisted by Captain James P/ Lyons, Mess and Supply Officer, Captain Milliam R. Reny, Adjutant, and Captain Ira W. Black, Commander of the Military Police Section.

In 1942 the Infantry School Detachment was changed to Academic Regiment and remained as such until 1 November 1946 in which time it was redesignated "The Infantry School Detachment," Companies A & B were Academic Regiment redesignated to ompany A.& B Infantry School Detachment on 1 November 1946. Company "C" was activated 8 ovember 1946. Company "D""Officers" was activated 17 May 1947. Company "E" was activated 2 May 1951. Company "F" was activated 18 une 1951. Company "G" was activated 15 ovember 1951.
