

1. Paragraph 134, AR 670-5, Change 4, dated 12 October 1963 (Tab A), grants appropriate approving authorities the authority to alter Infantry Branch Insignia by the placement of a numerical designation of the unit involved thereon.

2. So as to more closely identify the officer personnel assigned to the Officer Candidate School and to the Officer Candidate School program, it is recommended that the alteration of the Infantry Branch Insignia as indicated in Tabulation B be authorized. While it is recognized that the regulation itself specifies numerical designation, it is felt that there is sufficient latitude inherent in the regulation so that the letters OCS could be used. The adoption of the proposed insignia would be a means of quick and easy identification of those officers associated with the Officer Candidate Program, by personnel without the program, and to the candidates of their command.

3. It is proposed that when this alteration is approved that all officer personnel presently assigned to the Officer Candidate School will purchase a set of the insignia through the facilities of the United States Army Infantry Center book store. All officers assigned subsequent to approval will be presented a set of the insignia upon their assignment to the Officer Candidate School with funds being made available through the Officers' Special Activities Fund, which is authorized to make such purchases by appropriate regulations.

4. With the Infantry Officer Candidate School rapidly approaching its 25th Anniversary and with there presently being over 81,000 graduates of the previously mentioned program, it is strongly believed that the adoption of the insignia proposed herein is warranted and will greatly enhance the prestige of both the officers assigned the Officer Candidate







1. Review of paragraph 134, AR 670-5, discloses no apparent basis for latitude of interpretation to permit other than unit numerical designation to be added to branch insignia.

2. It is believed that the "crossed rifles," with their proud tradition, already enhance the prestige of the wearer. Further, there is some disadvantage in the resemblance of the proposed insignia to that being worn by some military school cadets. Adoption of the proposed device would tend to inhibit ready identification of the wearer as an officer without significant increase in his prestige or that of the OCS program.

3. For the reasons outlined above, this headquarters does not support to Department of the Army the basic request, nor approve local adoption of the modified insignia, as contemplated by paragraph 4, basic letter.

133. Insignia of branch—how worn. As used in this section the word "collar" refers to that part of the coat, jacket, or shirt around the neck which forms a neckband and turnover piece. The word "lapel" will be used when referring to the "reverse" of coats and jackets.

a. Officers and warrant officers.

- (1) On both lapels of the coat as shown in ① and ②, figure 31.
- (2) On left collar of shirt as shown in figure 44.

b. Enlisted personnel.

- (1) On the left collar of the coat as shown in ③, figure 31.
- (2) On left collar of shirt as shown in figure 50. Male enlisted personnel undergoing basic training will not wear insignia of branch.

* **134. Description of insignia of branch.** The numerical regimental or battalion designation in ¼-inch numerals on branch insignia for Armor, Artillery, Corps of Engineers, and Infantry is authorized on an optional basis. Multiple piece insignia for enlisted personnel are authorized on an optional basis. Optional items will not be furnished from appropriated funds.

a. Adjutant General's Corps.

- (1) *Officers* (①, fig. 51). A shield 1 inch in height, a chief of blue with 1 large and 12 small white stars thereon, and 13 vertical strips, 7 white and 6 red.
- (2) *Enlisted personnel* (②, fig. 51). A shield consisting of a chief with 1 large and 12 small stars thereon and 13 vertical stripes on a 1-inch disk, all of gold color metal.

b. Armor.

- (1) *Officers* (①, fig. 52). The front view of a M-26 tank, gun slightly raised, superimposed on two crossed cavalry sabers in scabbards, cutting edge up, $1\frac{3}{16}$ inch in height overall, of gold color.
- (2) *Enlisted men* (②, fig. 52). The front view of a M-26 tank, gun slightly raised, superimposed on two crossed cavalry sabers in scabbards, cutting edge up, on a 1-inch disk, all of gold color metal.

c. Army Medical Service.

(1) *Officers.*

- (a) *Dental Corps* (①, fig. 53). A gold color caduceus, 1 inch in height, with

the letter "D" $\frac{3}{8}$ inch in height in black color superimposed thereon.

(b) *Medical Corps* (②, fig. 53). A gold color caduceus, 1 inch in height.

(c) *Medical Service Corps* (③, fig. 53). A silver color caduceus, 1 inch in height, with a monogram consisting of the letters "MS" $\frac{3}{8}$ inch in height in black color superimposed thereon.

(d) *Veterinary Corps* (④, fig. 53). A gold color caduceus, 1 inch in height, with the letter "V" $\frac{3}{8}$ inch in height in black color superimposed thereon.

(e) *Army Nurse Corps* (⑤, fig. 53). A gold color caduceus 1 inch in height with the letter "N" $\frac{3}{8}$ inch in height in black color superimposed thereon.

(f) *Army Medical Specialist Corps* (⑥, fig. 53). A gold color caduceus, 1 inch in height, with a monogram consisting of the letter "S" $\frac{3}{8}$ inch in height in black color superimposed thereon.

(2) *Enlisted personnel* (⑦, fig. 53). A caduceus on a 1-inch disk, all of gold color metal.

d. Army Security, USAR. Rescinded.

e. Unassigned to branch—enlisted personnel (fig. 55). The coat of arms of the United States on a 1-inch disk, all of gold color metal.

f. Artillery.

(1) *Officers* (①, fig. 56). A missile surmounting two crossed field guns, all of gold color, $1\frac{1}{8}$ inches in height.

(2) *Enlisted personnel* (②, fig. 56). A missile surmounting two crossed field guns on a 1-inch disk, all of gold color metal.

g. Chaplains.

(1) *Christian faith* (①, fig. 57). A silver color Latin cross 1 inch in height.

(2) *Jewish faith* (②, fig. 57). A double tablet bearing Roman numerals from I to X surmounted by two equilateral triangles interlaced, all of silver color, 1 inch in height.

h. Chemical Corps.



1. PROBLEM: To dispose of a request (Tab A) by The Student Brigade, USAIS, for promotion (appointment) authority for personnel assigned to the Parachute Maintenance Section, USAIC TC.

2. FACTS BEARING ON THE PROBLEM:

a. General Orders Number 60, USAIC, 12 July 1960 (Incl 1 to Tab A) transferred the Quartermaster Parachute Maintenance Section from the Airborne Air-Mobility Department, USAIS, to the Quartermaster Section, USAIC, effective 1 July 1960.

b. Enlisted personnel performing duty with the Parachute Maintenance Section are assigned to the USAIC TC. They are attached to The Student Brigade for rations, quarters and administration. Attachment does not include promotion (appointment) and reassignment authority.

c. General Orders Number 60 do not mention which organizational element has the authority to handle matters relating to the administration of military justice.

d. The back-up for General Orders Number 60 (Tab B) obtained from the US Army Records Center, St. Louis, Missouri, does not explain why the Parachute Maintenance Section was transferred from USAIS to USAIC.

3. DISCUSSION:

a. The assignment of personnel to one organization and their attachment to another organization on an indefinite term basis is an unsound administrative practice and often detrimental to their morale. They can all too easily be forgotten by the parent organization when appointment allocations are doled out, particularly when the allocations are small.

b. Assignment to one organization with attachment to another organization complicates personnel accounting in that personnel must be reported on morning reports for two units. The Army Personnel Accounting System (major command data processing centers) does not process morning report remarks relating to attached personnel. If the unit of attachment neglects to furnish "reportable" data to the unit of assignment for inclusion on the morning report, it is never recorded in the system.

c. The fact that General Orders Number 60 do not spell out who has authority in the administration of military justice could lead to complications--both current and in the future when researching historical records for the purpose of determining the validity of a particular action.

4. CONCLUSION: Unless there are compelling reasons to the contrary, the Parachute Maintenance Section should be incorporated in the Table of Distribution for The Student Brigade and personnel reassigned accordingly. An alternate solution would be to amend General Orders Number 60 by rescinding so much as pertains to attachment of personnel to The Student Brigade for rations, quarters and administration.

5. ACTION RECOMMENDED: The Parachute Maintenance Section be transferred to The Student Brigade and general orders be published effecting the transfer.
