ORGANIZATION OF THE INFANTRY-AIRBORNE REQUIREMENTS COMMITTEE (IARC)

1. Effective 24 May 1948, the Airborne Requirements Board is discontinued.
2. Effective 24 May 1948, the Infantry Requirements Board is redesignated the Infantry-Airborne Requirements Committee (IARC) and will assume all functions previously designated for both the Infantry and the Airborne Requirements Boards. It will take over and complete all projects which have been assigned to the two Boards.

4. Associate members, listed in paragraph 3 b above, if transferred from The Infantry Center, will be replaced by the parent unit with an officer of the same branch or service.

5. All permanent and associate members who are not graduates of the Air Transportability Course will complete that course as soon as practicable.

6. The mission of the Infantry-Airborne Requirements Committee is to assist The Commanding General, The Infantry Center, in carrying out his function as an agency of Army Field Forces in the development and perfection of Infantry and Airborne tactics and techniques. It will conduct studies and carry out such projects as are approved or directed by The Commanding General, The Infantry Center.

7. The purpose of the Committee is to develop new ideas and determine the needs for changes in Infantry and Airborne means and methods. Through library research and taking of testimony from selected individuals, it will arrive at conclusions and recommendations pertaining to assigned problems. The group is not expected to conduct field tests or laboratory experiments. Projects, pertaining to the Infantry and to the Airborne Division, which may be assigned to the Committee for study, include organization, tactics and doctrine, training, armament, equipment, materiel, and principles and technique of ground and air movement.

8. By arrangement through the Assistant Commandant and/or the commander of other agencies to which they belong, associate members, in addition to their other duties, will be available to the President of the Infantry-Airborne Requirements Committee for coordination and study on all matters pertaining to their branch or service. When pertinent, they will effect liaison coordination between the Committee and their arm or service.

9. Once a project has been approved or assigned for study, the Requirements Committee normally will conduct a preliminary study to develop the subject and will prepare a list of controversial questions. Copies of the basic study and the questions will be forwarded through the commanders of the agencies to which selected witnesses belong. Witnesses may then either arrange to testify orally before the Committee at a time and place satisfactory to both, or submit written testimony to it through the commander of his agency. Considering all testimony, the Requirements Committee will complete the study and arrive at conclusions and recommendations.

10. Completed studies will be referred to the Assistant Commandant for comment prior to submission to The Commanding General, The Infantry Center, for approval.

11. Projects, concerning weapons and equipment, which are within the scope of development and test by Army Field Forces Board Number 3, will be referred to that Board for comment prior to final action.

12. Completed studies with comments of pertinent agencies will then be forwarded to The Commanding General, The Infantry Center, with proposed recommendation for implementing action. The Requirements Committee will furnish the Assistant Commandant and, where applicable, the Army Field Forces Board Number 3 with a copy of final action taken by The Commanding General.

General Orders No. 49 (TIC)(21 May 48)(Cont'd)

13. The above procedure is not intended to prevent normal contacts between members of the Infantry-Airborne Requirements Committee and individuals of other agencies for information and assistance in developing projects where personal opinion is desired. In order to utilize the experience and background of specially trained personnel, permit exchange of ideas, and stimulate free discussion of problems, informal direct liaison is authorized between individuals. Similarly, members of one agency may be invited to, and may participate in conferences, and witness tests conducted by another agency. Remarks of an individual expressed on such occasions are not to be considered as the official opinion of the agency to which the individual belongs unless the commander of the agency delegates such authority in each particular case.


