





1. Department of the Army and United States Continental Army Command in making comparative studies of the staffing of service schools use a ratio factor of personnel assigned to student load. Presently the United States Army Infantry School has an unfavorable ratio. This is due to various elements and activities being assigned to the US Army Infantry School that at other service schools are assigned to their respective centers and/or are being accomplished by separate table of distribution units. The major unit of the United States Army Infantry School Table of Distribution to which these various elements and activities are assigned is The School Brigade.

2. United States Continental Army Command has been apprised of this situation and has informally recommended action be taken to revise our organization to make it comparable with other schools.

3. Request permission to establish The School Brigade as a separate table of distribution unit and to designate the new unit as "The Student Brigade."

2. 
